Dear Mr. Pierson:

By letter dated January 10, 2006, Mr. James D. Wiesbeck, Supervisor of the Rapid City Field Office for the Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) notified Crow Butte Resources, Inc. (CBR) that the Field Office had determined that MSHA would no longer exercise jurisdiction over the Crow Butte Uranium Mine and that our Mine Identification Number 25-01034 had been entered as "permanently abandoned" on agency records. The basis of this conclusion was a Federal Mine Safety and Health Review Commission Administrative Law Judge decision made in 2001 concerning the application of the definition of a mine from the Federal Mine Safety and Health Act of 1977 to solution mines.

As a result of this decision, the Crow Butte Uranium Mine will fall under the jurisdiction of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970. CBR has retained legal counsel and a consultant specializing in OSHA regulatory programs to assist in compliance issues and completing the transition of our safety program to OSHA standards.
