Last week onsite, we finished up the 80-10 review and 50.75G decommissioning file review. Nothing of significance found. Some push needed to convince the licensee that they need to do a root cause review of the tritium ground contamination. Something is underway and the resident inspectors are hot on that trail. They should have initiated a root cause early on. Not consequential since they are now making some efforts to systematically evaluate all underground structures as potential sources. A tracer strategy still has to be worked out. It looks like the public meeting will be held on March 28th at Crystal Bay. Not official yet, but it is getting firmed up quickly.
