Dear Mr. Johnson:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 98 amending your NRC Material License No. 21-01430-01 in accordance with your request. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

In correspondence dated March 31, 2006, and April 28, 2006, you indicated that you wished to release your former area of use, the Radiopharmaceutical Administration and Storage Room, for unrestricted use. The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from your former Radiopharmaceutical Administration and Storage Room noted above and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for this location and it is suitable for unrestricted use.

In accordance with the telephone conversations between you and me on April 21, 2006, and April 28, 2006, and the instruction in the facsimile dated April 28, 2006, I reviewed this request only at this time. Your letter dated February 15, 2006, received in our offices on April 5, 2006, originally controlled in under number 315377, will be reviewed at a later date by combining it into the review pending with control number 315282.

The enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.
