Bob - my thought is it would be OK depending on the type of bottle and extra survey methods to demonstrate contamination control. You would also need to check the license to see if an amendment was needed because most licenses prevent eating, drinking, and smoking in rad controlled areas.

I would expect the licensee to commit to smearing the bottles routinely as part of their routine survey program to ensure that there is no contamination. Also, I would prohibit the use of the type of bottles that you buy at the grocery store where you have to pull the plastic mouthpiece to open. The best would be the type bottle that sports teams use that you don't have to open, you just squirt into your mouth.
