## **CAPE COD COMMISSION**

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### What is the Cape Cod Commission?

The Commission is the Barnstable County agency responsible for regional planning and land use regulation throughout Cape Cod.

It was created as successor to the Cape Cod Planning and Economic Development Commission on March 27, 1990, by a special act of the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts that was ratified by Countywide referendum.

The Commission is composed of 19 members: a representative from each of the County's 15 municipalities; one Barnstable County Commissioner; one Native American; one representative of the minority population who is appointed by the Barnstable County Commissioners; one representative of the minority population who is appointed by the Governor.

The Regional Policy Plan that provides regional development standards and guides Commission decision-making was adopted by the Commission and approved by the Assembly of Delegates (the County legislative branch) in 1991, with revision scheduled at 5-year intervals. The Regional Policy Plan outlines Capewide values, goals and official policies and suggests protective strategies.

The Cape Cod Commission Act (Chapter 716 of the Acts of 1989, as amended) authorizes designation of sensitive resource areas as Districts of Critical Planning Concern (DCPC), with provision for special protective regulation.

The Commission Act also provides for Commission regulation of relatively large development projects known as Developments of Regional Impact (DRI).

In addition to providing community planning assistance and analysis of DRI project impacts, the Commission staff conducts planning programs concerning economic development, affordable housing, transportation, water resources, solid and hazardous waste management, and coastal zone management. The staff also maintains a database of demographic and economic information plus a geographic information system (GIS)

#### Introduction

CapeTrends presents Cape Cod Commission staff analysis of current data collected from a variety of state, federal and local agencies, as well as private-sector organizations, to indicate demographic and economic characteristics and trends of Barnstable County (Cape Cod) and its 15 towns.

This publication provides facts and indicators concerning Cape Cod population and housing growth and characteristics, employment, unemployment and income levels, along with a host of other data sought by businesses, professionals, public agencies and officials, as well as the general public, to document the demographic and economic composition and trends of the region.

Where possible, county data are presented by town - and village - along with statewide totals and data from prior years, for comparison.

CapeTrends contains the most up-to-date information available at the time of publication. Since a variety of new data are issued throughout the year, readers are encouraged to inquire about the availability of post-publication updates, variations in available data and presentation format, and other related information. For example, some of the data included in this publication also appear in individual town profiles for the convenience of those seeking information for a single town.

The demographic and economic information presented in CapeTrends is representative of the Commission's extensive Barnstable County (Cape Cod) information resource. As an affiliate agency of the State Data Center (Massachusetts Institute for Social and Economic Research [MISER] at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst), the Cape Cod Commission maintains a current, comprehensive collection of data from the U.S. Census Bureau issued in print and on CD-ROM ("compact disc - read-only memory"). In addition to demographic and economic information collected from a number of government agencies and private-sector organizations, the Commission also maintains a regional geographic information system (GIS) database and an array of technical information on topics including affordable housing, coastal zone management, architectural and landscape design, historic preservation, solid and hazardous waste management, transportation and water resources planning, land use, growth management and zoning.

Besides distributing this publication, the Commission staff responds to hundreds of inquiries annually for specific demographic and economic information concerning Barnstable County and its municipalities. Approximately half of these inquiries are business-related, often involving market research for businesses planning to locate or expand on Cape Cod.

CapeTrends is intended to provide the demographic and economic information commonly sought for this region, but further elaboration and related data are also available, and inquiries and comments are always welcome by telephone or mail, in person or electronically (E-mail frontdesk@capecodcommission.org or visit the Commission Information Center on the World Wide Web at www.capecodcommission.org).

## Demographic and Economic Characteristics and Trends

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#### CAPE COD DEMOGRAPHIC AND ECONOMIC TRENDS

#### **POPULATION**

For 78 years, the population growth-rate of Barnstable County (Cape Cod) has led Massachusetts counties. For five decades, from the 1930's to 1980, it topped all 14 counties, slipping behind island-neighbor Dukes County (Martha's Vineyard) in 1990. Since the 1990 U.S. Census, estimates of the U.S. Census Bureau put the Cape growth rate ahead of the State's 12 mainland counties, following only the pace of the two island counties (Dukes and Nantucket).

In 70 years - from 1920 to 1990 - the population of Barnstable County grew sevenfold, exceeding 50% growth in the decades of the 1950's and 1970's. Between 1980 and 1990, Cape population grew by 26% (from 147,925 to 186,605), following Dukes County's 30%.

By 1997, according to U.S. Census Bureau estimates issued in March 1998, Cape population was 205,128, just 272 short of the total projected for the year 2000 by the Massachusetts Institute for Social and Economic Research (MISER). Barnstable County continued to lead the 12 mainland Massachusetts counties with its 9.9% growth rate from 186,605 in 1990, exceeded only by the growth rates of the two islands: Nantucket's estimated 24.9% (from 6,012 in 1990 to 7,508 in 1997) and Dukes County's 16.7% (from 11,639 in 1990 to 13,578 in 1997).

As the only Massachusetts county where resident deaths outnumbered births between 1990 and 1997, Barnstable County offset that net loss with the highest net inmigration of residents of all 14 Massachusetts counties. The Cape's net in-migration estimate of 20,157 was more than triple neighboring Plymouth County's 6,654. Between 1980 and 1990, Barnstable County also claimed the highest in-migration rate in Massachusetts.

Population growth throughout Massachusetts between 1980 and 1990 amounted to 279,388 or 5%. The U.S. Census Bureau estimated Statewide population at 6,117,520 in 1997, increasing by 101,095 or 1.7% since 1990.

The town of Barnstable has the largest population of the 15 Cape Cod communities with 40,949 residents in 1990, 22% of the Barnstable County total, and it added the most new residents (10,051) between 1980 and 1990. The U.S. Census Bureau estimates the town population at 43,699 in 1996, a net gain of 2,750 (+ 7%) since 1990, second highest gain of the 351 Massachusetts cities and towns (following Franklin's 4,569).

Highest percentage growth from 1990 among Cape towns occurred in Sandwich at 16% (from 15,489 to 17,916), according to the 1996 Census Bureau estimates.

Between 1980 and 1990, population growth in the town of Mashpee led not only Cape towns but the entire State and probably all of New England, more than doubling (+113%) from 3,700 in 1980 to 7,884 in 1990. The town's in-migration rate also led the Cape and likely the State and New England region, as well. By 1996, Mashpee population was

estimated at 8,935, up 13% since 1990.

### Age Distribution

The median age of Cape Codders rose nearly nine years over the past three decades: from 30.8 years in 1960 (34.3 in 1970 and 37.1 in 1980) to 39.5 in 1990, highest of the 14 Massachusetts counties.

The Statewide median in 1990 was 33.6, up 2.5 years over the decade, slightly above the Cape's 2.4.

Viewing the County age distribution in 10-year segments indicates that residents aged 30-something dominate, at 28,981, 16% of the total.

Greatest growth from 1980 to 1990 was evident in the 40-49 age group, with a gain of 10,796, nearly doubling (+86%) to reach 23,352.

Still, as its median age suggests, Barnstable County led its counterparts across the State in 1990 with 22% of its residents aged 65 and over, significantly ahead of second-place Berkshire County's 17% and the Statewide level of 14%.

Cape residents aged 65-74 represented 13% of the total, as in 1980, while the proportion aged 75-84 rose from 6% in 1980 to 7% in 1990, and the 85+ age group remained at 2% of all residents.

By 1996, the U.S. Census Bureau estimated Cape population aged 65+ at 46,137, 22.8% of the total. This growth-rate of 11% in five years led all Massachusetts counties and was nearly double the 6% Statewide rate of elder growth.

#### **School Enrollment**

Following a 1980-90 loss of 77 students, Cape public school enrollment increased by 4,194 or 16% from 26,477 in 1990 to 30,671 by 1996. Enrollment in the seven elementary grades (K-6) was up 15% (2,362) from 1990 to 1996, grades 7 and 8 up 32% (1,148), and 9 through 12 up 10% (684). Mashpee reported the Cape's highest enrollment-growth rate at 54% overall between 1990 and 1996, including the same growth rate - also the Cape's highest - for grades 9 through 12. The grade 7-8 component of Wellfleet enrollment topped Mashpee's 1990-96 growth rates at 69%, although it represented just 33 additional students and total enrollment was a more moderate 17%.

## Race and Hispanic Origin

The 1990 U.S. Census counted 8,649 nonwhite and Hispanic white residents in Barnstable County, an increase of 53% from 5,648 in 1980, while non-Hispanic white residents increased 25% from 142,967 in 1980 to 179,551 in 1990.

The largest proportion of the County's 7,054 nonwhite residents in 1990 was black (2,827), followed by the "other races" category (2,079), American Indian (1,180), and Asian (968). The Hispanic white population totaled 1,595.

### **Summer Population**

Cape population is estimated to nearly triple from winter to summer, topping half a million with the influx of summer residents and visitors.

The Cape Cod National Seashore estimated 4.6 million visits to its various sites in 1997, with 39% of the annual total occurring in the months of July and August.

#### HOUSING

With the addition of 35,246 new housing units in the decade, Barnstable County's housing total rose 35% from 99,946 in 1980 to 135,192 in 1990. Only two other Massachusetts counties added more new housing over this span: Middlesex with 50,830 and Worcester with 39,593. Nearby Nantucket's 47% increase in housing units was the only county gain to exceed the Cape's 35% housing-growth rate between 1980 and 1990. The Statewide housing total grew by 12% over the decade.

Households - those housing units occupied by Cape residents - increased by 19,030 over the decade from 58,556 in 1980 to 77,586 in 1990, a 32.5% gain that led the state's 14 counties. Statewide growth in the number of households was 10.5%.

Within Barnstable County, the town of Barnstable led with 6,934 new housing units over the decade, increasing the town total to 23,370 in 1990. The town of Mashpee led the County in percentage gain, adding 3,420 units and nearly doubling (+95.5%) its 1980 housing total of 3,582 to 7,002 in 1990.

The increase in year-round households followed the same pattern, as the town of Barnstable led the County with 4,587 new households over the decade (raising the total to 16,601 in 1990), while Mashpee registered the highest percentage gain at (+121%), more than doubling the 1980 total to 3,158 in 1990 with the addition of 1,729 new households.

#### HOMEBUILDING

From 1990 through 1997, 11,997 new homes were approved for construction in Barnstable County. Assuming all were built, Cape Cod housing stock increased 9% from the 1990 U.S. Census count of 135,192 to 147,189 by 1998.

Four Cape towns each issued permits for over 1,000 new homes from 1990 through 1997, half the County total: Falmouth - 1,755, Barnstable - 1,718, Sandwich - 1,345, Mashpee - 1,208. By 1998, housing in the town of Barnstable totaled an estimated 25,088 units, leading all Cape towns with 17% of the County's housing.

The highest percentage growth in housing from 1990 through 1997 occurred in the town of Sandwich where approval of 1,345 new homes increased housing stock by 19%, more than double the Capewide housing-growth rate. The neighboring town of Mashpee had the second-highest Cape housing-growth rate at 17%, with addition of an estimated 1,208 units since 1990.

From 1990 through 1997, Cape towns issued permits for an average of 1,500 new

homes annually, led by Falmouth's annual average of 219 new-home approvals and Barnstable's 215.

#### **HOME SALES**

Cape home sales increased 22% to 6,346 in 1997 from 5,219 in 1996, according to County Data Corporation tabulation of sales in Barnstable County. Sales of 1,208 homes in the town of Barnstable (led by 295 Hyannis sales) represented 19% of the Cape total.

The median price of Cape home sales in 1997 was \$129,900 (compared with \$148,000 Statewide), and Provincetown led Cape towns with a median price of \$220,000 for 105 sales.

Statewide home sales increased by 3,916 (5%) from 1996 to 1997, and the 1,127 increase in Cape home sales led the State's 14 counties with more than one-fourth (29%) of the State gain. Home sales increased from 1996 to 1997 in all 15 Cape towns and in all but four of the State's counties (Nantucket, Plymouth, Franklin and Hampshire), per County Data Corporation.

The Massachusetts Association of Realtors® reported 4,185 home sales through the Cape Cod and Islands Multiple Listing Service, up 13.4% from 3.691 in 1996 and ahead of the Statewide gain of 11.3% in Realtors'® home sales.

Cape Realtors'® home sales prices averaged \$178,191 in 1997, and the 5.2% gain from \$169,328 in 1996 topped the Statewide increase and led all 7 State regions. Realtors'® home sales throughout the State averaged \$200,147 in 1997, 3.8% over \$192,804 in 1996.

Over half (53%) of Cape Realtors'® home sales in 1997 fell below \$140,000 (33% between \$100,000 and \$140,000 and 20% below \$100,000), with another 24% between \$140,000 and \$200,000, and the final 23% over \$200,000.

#### **ECONOMIC BASE**

The Cape Cod economic base was valued at an estimated \$1.6 billion in 1992: 44% derived from tourists and seasonal residents; 15% retirement-based income, 11% from business services, 7% from commuters, 6% from manufacturing, 5% each from marine and defense industries and 7% from miscellaneous sources.

#### **EMPLOYMENT WITHIN COUNTY**

Public and private-sector employment in Barnstable County averaged 77,332 in 1996, up 2% from 75,773 in 1995, according to the most recent annual data available from the Massachusetts Division of Employment and Training (DET). This rate of Cape employment growth was slightly ahead of the 1.9% Statewide gain.

For the sixth consecutive year, private-sector employment represented 85% of the Cape total in 1996. Across the State, private-sector employment amounted to 87% of all employment reported to the DET.

Overall Cape 1996 employment levels ranged 35% between seasonal extremes:

66,602 in January and 89,710 in July.

State employment records indicated a total of 7,914 public and private-sector employers in Barnstable County in 1996.

The largest share of Cape Cod employment was in the Service industry, with nearly one-third of the annual average at 24,733, followed closely by Retail Trade's 24,363.

The Service industry had the largest share of employers (2,715, over one-third of the total for all industries) and its \$608-million payroll topped all industries, at one-third of the 1996 total.

### Employers of 1,000+

Leading the 13 Cape industries with employment of 1,000 or more, the 755 Eating and Drinking Places in Barnstable County employed 9,873, increasing two and one-half times from 6,112 in January to 15,337 in July.

The County's second-place employer was the umbrella category of Local Government, whose 174 units employed 8,211 personnel in 1996, over half (54%) of them staffing 30 Elementary and Secondary schools.

The Cape's 158 Grocery Stores employed the third highest number at 3,565, while 315 Cape Hotels and Motels ranked fourth in 1996, averaging 3,382 employees, more than tripling from 1,706 in January to 5,373 in July.

Fifth-highest Cape employment was concentrated in 35 Nursing and Personal Care Facilities at 2,732, followed by 4 Cape Hospitals with 2,327.

In seventh place, 29 Home Health Care Services employed 2,046, while 315 Cape Miscellaneous Shopping Goods Stores (gift and specialty shops including bookstores and retailers of photographic supplies) ranked eighth in 1996 with a collective staff of 2,028, ranging 59% from 1,587 in February to 2,519 in August.

The Federal Government was the ninth-largest Cape employer in 1996, with 1,812 personnel in 95 units, over half of them Post Offices collectively averaging 490 employees.

Tenth-highest Cape employment in 1996 was in 39 Research and Testing Services establishments, averaging 1,348.

State Government was the Cape's eleventh-largest employer in 1996, averaging 1,298 in 12 units, including 525 employed at three College and Health Service sites and 754 in eight offices related to Court Administration and Transportation Regulation and Administration.

In twelfth place, 133 Miscellaneous Amusement, Recreation Services employed 1,222 in such enterprises as physical fitness facilities, public golf courses, coin-operated amusement establishments, membership sports and recreation clubs, miniature golf courses and skating rinks.

The Cape's 170 Medical Doctors' Offices and Clinics ranked thirteenth with 1,143 employees in 1996.

### Industries with 1995-96 Employment Growth of 100+

Average employment increased by more than 100 in six Cape industries between 1995 and 1996, according to DET data.

The 10 employers in the Scheduled Air Transportation industry added the most employees from 1995 to 1996, more than doubling with the addition of 274 to reach 495, netting a 124% gain that also marked the highest percentage growth of any Cape industry.

Local Government followed, adding 243 employees between 1995 and 1996, while Hospitals added 132, Nursing and Personal Care Facilities 129, Eating and Drinking Places another 108, and Miscellaneous Special Trade Contractors 102.

## Industries with 1995-96 Employment Growth over 20%

Employment growth from 1995 to 1996 exceeded 20% in 11 Cape industries, led by the 124% gain in Scheduled Air Transportation employment. Personnel Supply Services employment also doubled (+110%) with the addition of 86 employees to 1995's 78 to reach 164 in 1996.

In third place, employment at Fruit and Vegetable Markets increased 52% from 140 in 1995 to 213 in 1996, followed by the 41.5% growth in Video Tape Rental employment to 116 in 1996 and 41% gain in Wholesale Electrical Goods workers to 117 in 1996.

Sixth-highest employment growth between 1995 and 1996 occurred in Candy Stores where the 38% increase led to 121 jobs in 1996. With the seventh-highest growth rate among Cape industries, Special Trade Contractors's 401 jobs were up 34% from 299 in 1995.

Local/Suburban Transportation employment increased 25% to earn eighth place at 115 in 1996, while School Buses employed 24% more at 391 in 1996 in ninth place.

In tenth place, eight Fruit-growers, likely dominated by the cranberry industry, added 23% more workers to total 49 in 1996, followed by another indigenous industry - Water Transportation Services - whose 22% job-growth contributed to 1996 employment of 339.

Nonagricultural employment in the Barnstable-Yarmouth Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) which encompasses 10 of the 15 Cape towns (without Bourne, Falmouth, Provincetown, Truro and Wellfleet) increased 3% from 53,900 in 1995 to 55,600 in 1996, ahead of the Statewide 2% gain and second among the State's 10 MSA's, following the 3.4% growth rate of the Lawrence-Haverhill Primary Metropolitan Statistical Area.

Besides the 77,332 jobs detailed above that are within Barnstable County but not necessarily held by residents, another 9,766 County residents were self-employed in 1990, according to the U.S. Census, an increase of 53% from 6,388 in 1980. Further, the Census indicated the number of Cape residents who commuted to work outside the County nearly

doubled (+ 77%) from 5,893 in 1980 to 10,446 in 1990, representing 13% of the 81,779 Cape residents who reported that they worked in late March or early April, 1990.

#### **OCCUPATIONS**

According to the 1990 U.S. Census, 83% of employed Cape residents aged 16 and over had one of six occupations: sales (15.1%); professional specialty (15.0%); administrative support/clerical (14%); service (13.4%); executive/administrative/ managerial (13.1%); precision production/craft/repair (12.4%).

#### LABOR FORCE

Massachusetts Department of Employment and Training records indicate the Barnstable County resident labor force averaged 104,652 in 1997: 98,615 employed and 6,037 unemployed, netting an unemployment rate of 5.8% for the second consecutive year, compared with a 1997 Statewide rate of 4.0%.

County 1997 labor force levels fluctuated between 94,238 in February and 121,361 in July, while unemployment rates ranged from 9.7% in January to 3.5% in August. The decline of the peak winter unemployment rate from the 1996 peak of 10.6% marked the first single-digit peak rate since 1989, following seven years of double-digit peak rates.

Massachusetts 1997 unemployment rates varied from 4.8% in January to 3.4% in October and December.

#### **MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME**

Median household income in Barnstable County was \$31,766 in 1989 according to the 1990 U.S. Census, led by Sandwich's \$43,500. The town of Brewster registered the highest growth in median household income over the decade 1979-89 with a gain of 123% to \$34,935, second highest in the County.

#### MEAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME BY SOURCE

The 1990 U.S. Census indicated that mean household income in Barnstable County derived from wages and salaries in 1989 was \$35,686, led by Sandwich at \$42,264, while the Statewide mean was \$45,022. In Barnstable County, 67% of all households had wage/salary income (topped by Bourne with 77%), while the Statewide proportion was 78%.

Mean household income in the County derived from self-employment was \$25,409 (with Bourne leading at \$31,711), ahead of the \$23,101 Statewide mean. Sixteen percent of Cape households had self-employment income (highest in Wellfleet at 30%), in comparison with 13% Statewide.

Mean household retirement income was \$11,208 in Barnstable County (led by Truro's \$14,698), above the Statewide mean of \$8,571. One-fourth of Cape households received retirement income (led by Dennis and Orleans at 32%), in contrast to 16% Statewide.

The County's mean household income derived from Social Security was \$8,340(topped by Chatham at \$9,361), exceeding the \$7,649 Statewide mean. Thirty-eight percent of Cape households received Social Security income (topped by Chatham at 51%), while the Statewide proportion was 27%.

Mean household income in the County derived from Public Assistance was \$4,742 (highest in Sandwich at \$7,675), also above the \$4,711 Statewide mean. Six percent of Cape households received Public Assistance income (highest in Wellfleet at 10%), below the Statewide 8%.

#### PER CAPITA INCOME

The 1990 U.S. Census listed Barnstable County per capita income in 1989 at \$16,402, compared with \$17,224 Statewide.

Cape per capita income increased 121% from 1979 to 1989, while the Statewide gain was 131%.

Orleans led Cape per capita income for the third consecutive decade at \$19,249 in 1989, while Brewster registered the highest growth rate from 1979 at 151%.

#### PERSONAL INCOME

Total Personal Income in Barnstable County was \$5.9 billion in 1996, up 6.4% from 1995, ahead of both the corresponding Statewide 5.4% and national 5.6% annual gains, according to the U.S. Commerce Department's Bureau of Economic Analysis.

Total Personal Income includes the Earnings (wages and salaries, other labor income, proprietors' income), Dividends, Interest, and Rent, and Transfer Payments received by Barnstable County residents.

In 1996, Cape residents' Earnings amounted to 52.7% of the region's Total Personal Income; Dividends, Interest, and Rent 27.4%; and Transfer Payments (retirement and other income from government and business for which no services were rendered during the year) 20.0%.

From 1995 to 1996, Earnings increased 6.7%, Dividends, Interest, and Rent 6.8%, and Transfer Payments 5.2%.

## **Earnings By Industry**

Earnings by persons employed in Barnstable County increased from \$2.6 billion in 1995 to \$2.7 billion in 1996, an increase of 5.8%.

The largest industries in 1996 were Services at 35.9 % of earnings; Retail Trade at 18.4%; and State and Local Government at 12.3%.

Of the industries with 5% of Cape earnings or more in 1996, the slowest growth from 1995 was the 4.2% rate of Transportation and Public Utilities (at 5.7% of Cape earnings in 1996), while Finance, Insurance and Real Estate (with 6.1% of Cape earnings) claimed

the highest earnings growth at 10.4%.

#### **RETAIL SALES**

The U.S. Census of Retail Trade in 1992 pegged Barnstable County retail sales at \$2.15 billion, up 6% from the previous five-year tally of \$2.02 billion in 1987, matching the Statewide percentage gain in Massachusetts.

Food stores led, with 267 establishments reporting sales of \$493.1 million, while the County 72 automotive dealers followed with sales of \$311.7 million. The County's 698 eating and drinking places reported 1992 sales of \$299.3 million.

Census Bureau analysis of retail sales 10 years earlier ranked Barnstable County 20th among the 3,139 U.S. counties in both 1982 retail sales per capita and, more specifically, per capita sales in eating and drinking places.

#### **SERVICE REVENUES**

The U.S. Census of Service Industries in 1992 reported overall service industry revenues of \$762 million in Barnstable County, up 33% from \$573.2 million in 1987, compared with Statewide growth of 44%.

Health services led Cape service industries with receipts of \$248.3 million, up 60% from \$155.1 million in 1987, followed by the lodging industry at \$158.5 million, 10% ahead of its \$144.2-million total in 1987.

#### PROPERTY VALUATION

Cape Cod's overall valuation of real and personal property increased by two and one-half times in the 10 years from \$10.35 billion in 1984 to \$25.1 billion by 1994, according to the biennial equalized valuation of the Massachusetts Revenue Commissioner. By 1996, the valuation for Barnstable County totaled \$25.3 billion, up 1% from 1994 and 73% in the decade from \$14.6 in 1986.

Valuations increased from 1994 to 1996 in all Cape towns except Yarmouth (down 4%), Barnstable and Dennis (both down 1%) and Mashpee (down 0.13%). All Cape town valuations increased over the decade, led by Truro's 108% gain from \$289 million in 1986 to \$600 million in 1996.

#### **PROPERTY TAX RATES**

Municipal property tax rates in Barnstable County in Fiscal Year 1998 (July 1, 1997 - June 30, 1998) ranged from \$7.78 in Truro to \$15.98 in Sandwich, with the Barnstable tax rate not yet available. In Fiscal Year 1997, the Statewide average was \$16.93.

The average municipal property tax bill in Fiscal Year 1997 (July 1, 1996 - June 30, 1997) for single-family homes in the County ranged from \$1,118 in Dennis to \$2,256 in Sandwich. The corresponding 1997 Statewide average, representing 339 reporting communities, was \$2,032.






# RESIDENT AND PROJECTED PEAK SUMMER POPULATION IN BARNSTABLE COUNTY 1990

## ESTIMATED AND PROJECTED RESIDENT - PULATION OF BARNSTABLE COUNTY 1980-2020





# ESTIMATED PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN POPULATION OF MASSACHUSETTS COUNTIES 1990-97







## BARNSTABLE COUNTY POPULATION 1765-1990



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




# PROPORTION OF BARNSTABLE COUNTY RESIDENTS AGED 25+ 1980-2010









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















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### Regional Policy Plan Economic Development Section

The Cape Cod Commission Regional Policy Plan (RPP) of 1991 laid out an economic development strategy that focused on the main sectors of Cape Cod's economic base, seeking to build on its fundamental strengths. The RPP included promoting off-season tourism, especially activities related to the region's environment and history, and retirees and balancing these resort-oriented sectors with attraction of "clean-light industry." The RPP also included supporting fishing, shell-fishing, and agriculture, which are connected to the Cape's natural resource base.

#### Changes Since 1991

Since 1991, various changes have taken place in the economy and in the institutional framework for addressing economic development on Cape Cod. The region's economy has emerged from the recession, but intensified global competition and down-sizing has increased concerns about the creation of good jobs.

Cape Cod's economy continues to have different attributes from the rest of New England. Its population and job pool have continued to grow more rapidly than the rest of the state. Between 1980 and 1994, Cape Cod jobs grew by 40.71% (the state rate of job growth was 10%), while population grew 32.6%. During the 1987-1991 recession Cape Cod suffered a job loss of 11%, but since then, jobs have grown by 8%, twice as fast as the rate of Massachusetts.

Cape Cod's economy is based on small businesses, with 92% of the region's companies employing fewer than 20 people. In addition, 9,766 or 12% of Cape residents are self-employed, twice as high as the state average.

The Cape's resort economy still produces seasonal swings in unemployment. For instance, in 1995, the winter unemployment peak was 12.1%, and the summer rate was 4.3%, for a (not yet available %) annual average. The seasonal swings are most pronounced in the Lower Cape, with Provincetown being the most drastic. The Provincetown's 1994 January unemployment rate was 51.5% and its August rate was 7.8% In 1994, the year-round Cape Cod labor force was approximately 91,000, with an added 26,000 summer workers joining it.

On the institutional side, Barnstable County established the Cape Cod Economic Development Council in 1991. Several of the responsibilities mentioned in the original Regional Policy Plan have been assumed by the Economic Development Council, including taking a leadership role in business retention, small business counseling and entrepreneurship, marketing the region to businesses, assistance to the fishing industry, and business advocacy.

The Economic Development Council spearheaded efforts to obtain state designation of all Barnstable County as an Economic Target Area (EOA), eligible for various state and local property tax incentives for new and expanding businesses.

The Cape Cod Commission's Economic Development Program has helped develop the heritage tourism initiative, which has included Heritage Week, Maritime Week, and the establishment of the non-profit coordinating organization Heritage Cape Cod. The Commission has developed an Industrial Land Survey which inventories 38 industrially-zoned areas in 13 towns with over 1,400 developable acres. The Cape Cod Commission has implemented a development agreement with the Falmouth Technology Park, which permits development there without Commission Development

of Regional Impact (DRI) review. The Commission also has pre-screened industrial areas in Bourne, Mashpee, Barnstable, Dennis, Harwich, and Orleans to determine prior to development how much space could be built and what sorts of infrastructure improvements would be required.

Several new organizations have been established to deal with economic issues on Cape Cod. The Lower Cape Cod Community Development Corporation (CDC) has developed a small business loan pool, a seafood marketing campaign, a Cape Cod products catalogue, and has been active in housing projects. The Cape Cod, Martha's Vineyard, and Nantucket regional Employment Board has been split off from the New Bedford area to focus exclusively on this region. The Cape Cod Center for the Environment & a Sustainable Economy has developed programs demonstrating how environmental protection can harmonize with and stimulate economic development in such areas as eco-tourism, environmental technology, and sustainable food production. Many Cape Cod towns have established economic development committees and undertaken specific projects. Mashpee, Harwich, Truro, and Provincetown have prepared economic development plans under the state's Local Partnership Program.

Several studies concerning Cape Cod's economy have enhanced understanding of the region's economy. Economist Dr. Edward Moscovitch, updated his study of the "Cape Cod Economic Base" (1994) from the 1987 original, determining some changes in the composition of the economic base. The Commission completed its Residents Survey (1995), which elicited the views of Cape Codders on environmental protection and economic development. The Barnstable County Department of Human Services has published "The Human Condition: A Study of the Human Environment on Cape Cod" (1995), which discussed the social issues connected to the economy.

### New Economic Issues

In updating the RPP, it has become apparent that there are several economic development issues confronting Cape Cod that were not apparent in 1991.

- 1. <u>Changing Economic Base</u>—Dr. Moscovitch's updated study of the "Cape Cod Economic Base" ascertained some changes in the regional economic base:
- Tourists & Seasonal (43.9%)—half of this is tourists; the other half represents seasonal residents, about one-half of which is retirees who own primary residences elsewhere
- Retirees (15.3%)—includes the health, service, and home maintenance industries that service this sector
- Business Services (11.1%)--includes legal, accounting, software, research (eg. Woods Hole), and management consulting
- Commuters (7.3%)—wealth brought in by people who live on-Cape and work off-Cape
- Other (7.3%)
- Manufacturing (5.7%)--includes marine electronics and manufacturing
- Defense (5%)--includes Massachusetts Military Reservation, U.S. Coast Guard, and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- Marine (4.5%)—includes fishing, marinas, boat-building, and related businesses
- 2. <u>Fishing Decline</u>—The fishing industry in the North Atlantic is in a crisis because of depletion of fishing stocks. Federal regulations are projected to reduce the amount of annual fish landings by more than 50%, thereby making the business unviable for scores of fishermen. The fishermen are confronting the issue of what new economic activities they can adopt.

3. Global Competition and Downsizing--According to UMass-Amherst Professor Craig Moore, co-author with Dr. Edward Moscovitch of The New Economic Reality: Massachusetts Prospects for Long-Term Growth (1994), global competition and restructuring are the shaping economic forces. Branch manufacturing plants on Cape Cod are proving susceptible to downsizing, but the region is not as threatened as metropolitan areas more reliant on industry. Nevertheless, the Cape still has to compete with other resort regions to maintain its tourism/retirement base. Economic downsizing also affects the Cape by layoffs and suppressing wages, benefits, and opportunities for general advancement.

Concerns about the Cape Cod economy include the number of jobs that do not pay enough to support a household. The need for "good jobs at good wages" is consistently voiced. In the Cape Cod Commission's 1995 Residents Survey, 42% responded that limited job opportunities was a "somewhat" to "big" problem during the past year, while 46% said that their salary did not match their job skills. The Barnstable County Department of Human Services' "The Human Condition: A Study of the Human Environment on Cape Cod" found that approximately 34% of those surveyed on the Cape consider themselves to be often in financial difficulties.

4. <u>Human and Health Services</u>—It is economically important for Cape Cod to maintain a strong human and health services support system. Not only do these sectors provide significant employment opportunities, especially in health care, they provide critical services that allow Cape workers to participate effectively in the economy. For instance, respondents to the 1995 Residents Survey said that insufficient health care (41%) and inadequate day care (21%) were "somewhat" to "big" problems for them during the past year. The Barnstable County Department of Human Services' "The Human Condition: A Study of the Human Environment on Cape Cod" reports that 10,000 Cape Codders are not covered by health insurance. This survey learned that 55% perceive that their household had "a lot of anxiety, stress, or depression" over the prior twelve months.

The profile of the 25% of respondents indicating they have "serious" economic problems shows that, in this group: 75% make less than \$32,000 per year; 65% work full-time year-round and 20% work part-time year-round; 56% of these households have children; 79% receive no governmental financial assistance. This profile indicates that, despite working full-time, many households are not making enough money to make ends meet. Another issue is lack of child care, which handicaps these workers in obtaining employment and causes a significant amount of emotional stress.

- 5. <u>Tax Base</u>—The constrained municipal tax base is an economic issue. Municipal costs and tax rates are rising, while federal and state assistance is not keeping pace. Thirty-one percent of respondents to the Commission's Survey considered tax increases among the top three problems facing their town. Municipalities are anxious about future population growth, especially among families, that would raise municipal expenditures further. Economic development is seen as a possible way of increasing the tax base.
- 6. Retailing—There has been considerable discussion about the impact of retail expansion on Cape Cod, especially by megastores, which some argue are inappropriately-scaled for the Cape while others argued that such developments should be encouraged. Some resident are concerned about adverse effects on existing local businesses, as well as the store's impacts on the environment, traffic congestion, and character of the region. The Resident's Survey showed that 56% opposed a "large discount wholesale or retail store," while 31% supported it; 65% opposed a "nationally advertised fast food chain," while 18% supported it.

Some claim that retail sprawl in general is inefficient and unsustainable. The standardized architecture and corporate signage tend to detract from Cape Cod's unique regional character. The

surplus of retail operations both locally and nationally indicates that over-retailing does not add to the region's economic pie. It ends up hurting smaller, locally-owned businesses and creating blight when existing retail buildings are vacated. This point of view argues that locally-owned businesses should be regarded as more of a benefit to the regional economy than national chains when development projects are being reviewed.

Yet others counter that as long as a business does no environmental harm and mitigates its impacts, it should be able to develop on Cape Cod. Some believe that any company should be able to open up on the Cape regardless of its impact on other local businesses.

7. Gambling Casinos—Gambling casinos, which are being debated by state government, are another form of activity which could damage the regional economy—by taking away significant business from existing retail, service, and entertainment establishments. The Barnstable County Assembly of Delegates approved a resolution in 1994 opposing the "initiation or expansion of legalized gambling in Massachusetts and most particularly in Barnstable County." Casino gambling in other communities has reduced the capacity of those communities to attract and retain nongambling businesses. Gambling activities also take a disproportionately high percentage of income from lower-income people and incur social and governmental costs through crime and domestic neglect as well as producing stresses on the fragile environment and the limited transportation infrastructure.

## Economic Development Strategies for Cape Cod

The Cape Cod Economic Development Council has pointed out that economic development strategies have changed significantly in the last five years:

"The factors affecting the locational decisions of businesses have shifted as international competition has increased. It is not clear that communities can compete for business solely by attempting to lower business costs. Increasingly the major concerns of business are the skills and adaptability of the work force, the quality of life in the community, access to institutions of higher education, the availability of appropriate sources of financing, the availability and affordability of housing and the quality of the physical infrastructure."

"More importantly there is a growing recognition among communities that new enterprises and small businesses are an important sources of new jobs and that aiding the expansion of existing businesses may be more effective than recruiting new companies."

"This new economic development paradigm requires cooperative relationships. Whether between town governments, businesses and Cape Cod Community College, or the public and private sectors, these partnerships can increase the effectiveness of any economic development strategy. The private sector, in particular, is a key partner with government in economic development initiatives."

Cape Cod's prime economic asset is its world-renowned geographical setting. Because of its location, Cape Cod has witnessed the fastest growth in population and jobs in New England in recent decades. The Cape's seaside setting attracts tourists, retirees, and second-home owners and is the critical element in attracting new entrepreneurs to Cape Cod. The economic opportunities and constraints of Cape Cod are inextricably tied to its location.

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With this in mind, strategies are proposed below for each sector of the region's economic base. The economic base is critical because it is made up of those industries that sell their goods and services to buyers outside the region. On Cape Cod, this means tourists or retirees, who earned their income outside the region. In the long run, a regional economy will not grow unless it increases what it sells to outside markets.

- -Tourism & Seasonal Residents-- Cape Cod must continue to maintain its attractiveness and enhance its special regional character. The region also should focus on expanding the shoulder seasons, while maintaining a strong competitive position during the peak summer months. Much has happened to develop historic, cultural, environmental, and recreational (including golf) tourism in the shoulder seasons, including such events as Heritage Week, Maritime Week, Festival Cape Cod, First Night, Walking Weekend, and a host of town-specific events. Such activities should be supported and expanded. Targeted marketing to international visitors and profitable niche markets from around the country also would expand the tourist economy. Arts facilities like the proposed Boch Center for the Arts, in Mashpee, can improve the Cape's cultural offerings. A Mid-Cape performing arts/conference center could provide year-round cultural programming to significantly enhance the shoulder seasons. Of those responding to the 1995 Residents Survey, 79% supported such a facility.
- Retirement--Retirement, which remains a strong economic sector for Cape Cod, relies primarily on the high quality of life that the Cape offers. The Cape has long-term potential with retirement, as the baby boom generation seeks to buy second and retirement homes. To maintain Cape Cod's attraction, environmental protection, cultural and social offerings, and health care are critical. It is also important to market Cape Cod as a specific retirement location to prospective relocatees.
- Clean, light industry--The Residents Survey, with 82% support, ranked a "clean, light industry such as a software development firm employing 100 people" as the most desirable development project for Cape Cod. Such a development would optimize economic gains while minimizing environmental harm.

Until recently, communities tried to recruit businesses seeking to expand or relocate. With global

geographical barriers to doing business in a national and international marketplace. Two critical issues for telecommunications on Cape Cod are: 1) a competitive telecommunications infrastructure and 2) adequate computer education and services. In the rapidly changing telecommunications field, Cape Cod needs to make sure that it has state-of-the-art network services that will allow local businesses and individuals to optimize the use of telecommunications. Although the market is likely to deliver many services, Cape Cod may have to take an aggressive approach to obtaining them due to its relatively remote location. Education, support services, and widespread availability of the Internet at reasonable rates also are critical to providing Cape Cod a competitive economic edge.

- Fishing—The fishing industry in the North Atlantic is in a crisis because of depletion of fishing stocks. Federal regulations are projected to reduce the amount of annual fish landings by more than 50%, thereby making the business unviable for scores of fishermen. It is hoped that stocks will be replenished over the next decade, reinvigorating the fishing industry. Nevertheless, displaced fishermen must find new livelihoods in the interim. Various programs are being offered to ease the transition.

Aquaculture has promise as a replacement activity, but regulations and policies have constrained this activity. Barnstable County is promoting aquaculture through education and regulatory streamlining. The county, state, and private sector are looking into cooperative efforts to expand from shellfish aquaculture to fin-fish aquaculture, including the use of deep-sea and on-land aquaculture processes.

#### Sustainable Economic Development

To support the development of these economic sectors, Cape Cod needs to create an economic context that, according to the Cape Cod Economic Development Council, builds "a community's capacity for shared and sustainable improvement in its economic well-being." The starting point for a sustainable economy is protection of natural resources. The Cape Cod Commission Regulatory Task Force Report (1994) explained the concept in plain terms: "In these days of accelerating knowledge about water pollution, air pollution, ground pollution, traffic pollution, and every other type of pollution we must be cautious about our treatment of the environment, or what makes Cape Cod special will be gone. No one worried about our fishing until the fish were gone."

Cape Cod residents responding to the 1995 Residents Survey supported policies that would promote sustainable development. For instance, 92% supported reusing existing sites for development, 91% favored keeping hazardous materials out of zones of contribution to the water supply, and 83% were for limiting the size of development.

These environmental goals can be achieved by siting development in appropriate places which have adequate infrastructure. The concept of growth centers, discussed elsewhere in the Regional Policy Plan and in Local Comprehensive Plans (LCPs), encourages areas of intensive development through adequate transportation and water/wastewater infrastructure and appropriate regulatory standards. The adoption of the LCPs by the towns will provide guidelines for future land use and infrastructure development and help to create a more efficient and predictable permitting process for development.

The growth center concept can be used in tandem with the state's Economic Target (ETA) and Opportunity (EOA) Areas. This incentive program offers a 5% state investment tax credit and 10% abandoned building credit and either a five-year property tax abatement or 20-year tax increment

financing on local real estate taxes. All of Barnstable County received the ETA designation in 1994, and several towns have obtained EOA designation for specific areas in their community. It is also expected that LCPs and EOAs will encourage the redevelopment of existing business districts, which is taking place across the Cape.

Besides implementing sound land use policies, the notion of sustainability also relates to economic and social policies. The regional economy should provide, as the Economic Development Council points out, "the public goods for all that represent a decent quality of life, including freedom from fear of crime and a sense of being part of a community. Advances in economic well-being are not very valuable unless they are sustainable over time."

Better education and job training, according to many economic strategists, is essential to economic development. High-quality work skills can enable a worker to take advantage of new occupational opportunities as they arise in the rapidly changing global economy. Cape Cod Community College, Massachusetts Maritime Academy, the Cape's various college extension programs, Job Training & Employment Corporation (JTEC), and the local school systems need to focus on teaching the skills that are needed in the work world. It has also been argued that Cape Cod needs expanded higher education, specifically a four-year college/graduate school.

One of the fundamental objectives of a Cape Cod economic development strategy is to increase the income and work opportunities of Cape Cod workers. The Barnstable County Department of Human Services "Human Condition" study and workshops have confirmed this. Year-round employment and higher wages and benefits are critical. A higher minimum wage, widespread health care benefits, portable retirement benefits, and readily available child care could allow more workers to support a family adequately. Affordable housing, which is constrained in a resort area like Cape Cod, is critical for workers on the Cape. The region also needs intensified attention to social needs and strengthening the traditional social service support network to allow lower-income households to support themselves.

# Agriculture

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Barnstable County Agricultural Trends, 1982-92

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### Barnstable County Agriculture Trends

1982 - 1987 - 1992

As detailed in the table on the following page, the number of farms in Barnstable County increased by 35 (+ 28%) to 158 in the five years between the U.S. agriculture censuses for 1982 and 1987. When the most recent census was conducted in 1992, however, the number of Cape farms had declined by 14 (- 9%) to 144, averaging 37 acres. Barnstable County farms occupied 5,340 acres in 1992, or 2.1% of County land area, up from 5,010 acres and 2% 20 years earlier.

Between 1982 and 1987, the number of farms in Barnstable County with resident farmers increased by 28 (+ 37%) to 103, including 85 "farmers by occupation" (a gain of 29 or 52%). Average age of resident farmers declined by nearly one year to 52.3. By 1992, 95 resident farmers were counted in the census, a loss of 8 (- 8%) in five years, with 89 of them "farmers by occupation," a gain of 4, (+ 5%), and the average age of resident farmers remaining 52.3.

Farms with cattle declined by nearly one-third between 1982 and 1987: those with beef cattle remained constant at 8, while those with milk cows decreased from 5 to 2 (- 60%). By 1992, Barnstable County had lost 6 farms with cattle, leaving only 5 (- 55%): 3 with beef cattle (a loss of 5, or 63%) and 2 with milk cows.

The number of farms with sheep and lambs, horses and ponies and poultry all increased between 1982 and 1987, but then declined 5 years later, so that 1992 totals were below 1982 levels.

Acreage devoted to cranberry cultivation in Barnstable County increased by 61 (+ 7%) from 1982 to 904 in 1987, with 15 additional cranberry farms (+ 28%), and the cranberry harvest (hundredweight) rose by 20% to 87,121. By 1992, cranberry acreage had increased by 66 (+ 7%) to 970 acres, while cranberry farms fell by 8 (- 12%) to 61, and the harvest swelled 30% to 112,955.

Nursery and greenhouse farms in Barnstable County expanded from 1982 to 1987 by 56% to number 42, while nursery acreage more than doubled to 73 and greenhouse area nearly doubled to 206,463 square feet. By 1992, one additional farm was counted in this category, while nursery acreage dropped to 55 (a loss of 18 acres or 25%). Greenhouse area increased 2% to 210,621 square feet by 1992.


