Other alternatives that were considered instead of requesting the exemption were:

- To dispose of the source through an approved waste facility such as the Chem-Nuclear Barnwell Disposal Site. Clearly, this is not desirable since the mossbauer spectroscopy researcher uses the source.
- The university could attempt to register the source with the NRC by furnishing information needed for the radiation safety evaluation as specified in (10 CFR Part 32, Subpart D, c). While this may be feasible, it would be very difficult, considering that Old Dominion University was not the manufacturer of the source and much of the information required by Subpart D applies to the manufacturer and its processing. Areas where the university could provide information (pertaining to radiation safety) were already furnished, as requested.
