SUBJECT: LICENSE AMENDMENT

Please find enclosed your new NRC License No. 05-29228-01 with revised Docket No. 30-36174, that has been authorized based on your request dated April 7, 2006, for a change in address on your license. Due to your change in address, the responsibilities for your license was changed from NRC Region I to NRC Region IV jurisdiction. Therefore all licensing correspondence should be directed to following address.

The revised regulation in 10 CFR 30.35(c)(5) requires that waste processors provide a decommissioning funding plan (DFP) to address all authorized materials in Parts 30, 40 or 70. Although you were previously exempted from the regulations in these Parts, we can not continue to exempt this section of the regulations and you must provide a DFP to establish decommissioning financial assurance. Guidance for establishing a DFP and performing a cost estimate may be found in NUREG-1757, Volume 3, "Consolidated NMSS Decommissioning Guidance," and located at: <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/nuregs/staff/sr1757/v3/>

Please submit a DFP plan within 60 days from the date of this letter. Subsequently, the cost estimate must be adjusted at intervals not to exceed three years and submitted to the NRC at the address provided above, as required by 10 CFR 30.35(e) and License Condition 20.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31, provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31, the enclosed materials license will not be made publicly available.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(10). You should review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any questions, please contact me at 817-276-6552.

NRC expects licensees to conduct their programs with meticulous attention to detail and a high standard of compliance. Because of the serious consequences to employees and the public that can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, you must conduct your radiation safety program according to the conditions of your NRC license, representations made in your license application, and NRC regulations. In particular, note that you must:

1. Operate by NRC regulations 10 CFR Part 19, "Notices, Instructions and Reports to Workers: Inspection and Investigations," 10 CFR Part 20, "Standards for Protection Against Radiation," and other applicable regulations.
2. Notify NRC in writing of any change in mailing address.
3. By 10 CFR 30.36(d) and/or license condition, notify NRC, promptly, in writing, and request termination of the license:
 - a. When you decide to terminate all activities involving materials authorized under the license whether at the entire site or any separate building or outdoor area;
 - b. If you decide not to acquire or possess and use authorized material; or
 - c. When no principal activities under the license have been conducted for a period of 24 months.
4. Request and obtain a license amendment before you:
 - a. Change Radiation Safety Officers;
 - b. Order byproduct material in excess of the amount, radionuclide or form authorized on the license;
 - c. Add or change the areas or address(es) of use identified in the license application or on the license; or
 - d. Change the name or ownership of your organization.
5. Submit a complete renewal application or termination request at least 30 days before the expiration date on your license. You will receive a reminder notice approximately 90 days before the expiration date. Possession of radioactive material after your license expires is a violation of NRC regulations.

In addition, please note that NRC Form 313 requires the applicant, by signature, to verify that the applicant understands that all statements contained in the application are true and correct to the best of the applicant's knowledge. The signatory for the application should be the licensee or certifying official rather than a consultant. Since the NRC also accepts a letter requesting amendment of an NRC license, the signatory for such a request should also be the licensee or certifying official rather than a consultant.

NRC will periodically inspect your radiation safety program. Failure to conduct your program according to NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC may result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; imposition of a civil penalty; or an order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy. The NRC no longer publishes the NRC Rules and Regulations loose leaf supplements due to budget constraints.
