SUBJECT: AMENDMENT NO. 02 TO NRC IMPORT LICENSE IW012

Dear Mr. Small:

Enclosed for your consideration is a letter dated February 23, 2006, from Perma-Fix/Diversified Scientific Services, Inc. (DSSI) requesting Amendment No. 02 to import license IW012. The license currently authorizes the import from Canada of up to 378,000 kg of Class A Radioactive Mixed Waste in the form of solids, semi-solids and liquids contaminated with up to 1,200 curies of tritium, C-14, mixed fission product radionuclides and other materials for incineration at DSSI's Boiler Industrial Furnace (BIF). The purpose of Amendment No. 02 is to: 1) extend the expiration date from March 31, 2006, to March 31, 2008; and 2) increase the quantity (total activity level) of radioactive contaminants authorized for import by 800 curies or from 1,200 to 2,000 curies. DSSI did not request an increase in the total volume (378,000 kg) of waste materials authorized for import consisting of contaminated oil, solvents, scintillation fluids, grease, paint chips, paint sludge, spent bead resins, power resins, activated carbon and other similar materials currently authorized for import. To date, DSSI reports having imported 137,700 kg of material with a total contamination level of 1,187 curies.

Public Notice that NRC received this amendment request was published in the Federal Register on May 22, 2006. In addition, NRC forwarded DSSI's request to the U.S. Department of State on April 17, 2006, for assistance in notifying the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission, and requesting the Department's views as to whether approving this amendment will be consistent with the guidelines in the Joint Convention on the Safety of Spent Fuel Management and Safety of Radioactive Waste Management. We are also forwarding copies of this request to the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation and the Southeast Compact Commission for Low-Level Radioactive Waste Management for consideration as well.

It would be greatly appreciated if within two weeks of the date of this letter, you could respond as to whether your organization has any objections to or comments on this proposal, or if necessary, to provide an estimate of how much additional time you would require to complete your review and provide a written response to NRC.
