This refers to a request for Amendment 10, and is a list of commitments made in support of that request. This is to confirm that RSA Laboratories, a Division of Radiation Safety Associates, Inc., will abide by the commitments made in this E-mail communication. This confirmation of the commitment is made at the request of David Collins of Region II.

This is to confirm that each time we use such sources for training at a temporary job site we will do all of the following:

1. Prepare a list of all sealed sources taken to temporary job site or transferred to "cooperating licensee". This list will be in the form of the shipping documents used to transfer the licensed material.
2. Physically verify that each source is returned to your facility upon completion of each training. This will be done on our in-house form for "Receipt of Radioactive Material."
3. Confirmation of receipt of the sources from the "cooperating licensee". Again, this will be done on our in-house form for "Receipt of Radioactive Material." The "cooperating licensee" will be notified of the receipt of the source(s) by fax, e-mail or letter, with a copy to the project file.
4. Maintain records of these transfers, including the dates of transfer and their return.

These records will consist of the shipping records from RSA to the "cooperating licensee," our in-house form for "Receipt of Radioactive Material," and a copy of the notification to the "cooperating licensee" notifying him of the return of our licensed material.

I realize that the license amendment will only apply to those sealed sources listed in Section 6D of our license.
