

14	SR. SPECIAL AGENT TEATOR: Who was waiting
15	for her?

17	And I believe was still here,

19	SR. SPECIAL AGENT TEATOR: Anything more
20	you can add about that, scheduling her out-processing
21	something?
22	No. It's usually done
23	between the client consultants, which is
24	They usually do the exit interviews, and they
25	usually do the scheduling of the out-processing.

1	SR. SPECIAL AGENT TEATOR: Switch back for
2	a minute. Her position was eliminated. Do you know
3	why her position was eliminated?
4	Well, in most cases, when
5	they're eliminated, it's because they don't need the
6	person around anymore. They just don't need the job.
7	SR. SPECIAL AGENT TEATOR: Do you know
8	specifically why her position was eliminated?
9	No. No, I don't.
10	SR. SPECIAL AGENT TEATOR: Jeff, I don't
11	have anything else to add. Have you got a passage or
12	something you want to review with her?
13	MR. KEENAN: I think we're good. Well,
14	let's take a quick break.
15	SR. SPECIAL AGENT TEATOR: Okay. It's
