SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF JUNE 21, 2006, OPEN MEETING WITH THE NUCLEAR
ENERGY INSTITUTE (NEI) TO DISCUSS RADIOACTIVE LIQUID
DISCHARGES FROM NUCLEAR POWER PLANTS (TAC NO. MD0229)

On Wednesday, June 21, 2006, a Category 1 public meeting was held between the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and representatives of NEI at NRC Headquarters, One White Flint North, 11555 Rockville Pike, Rockville, Maryland. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss radioactive liquid discharges from nuclear power plants. A list of attendees is enclosed.

The NRC staff met with NEI, licensee representatives, several members of the public, and media to discuss groundwater contamination at nuclear power plants. NEI discussed the major components of its voluntary industry initiative to be implemented at all U.S. nuclear power reactors.

Under the industry initiative, each licensee will establish a site-specific action plan. The action plan will contain the plans to implement a program to help assure timely detection and effective response to situations involving inadvertent releases in groundwater to prevent migration of licensed radioactive material offsite and quantify impacts on decommissioning.

Specifically, the action plan will:

- assess sources of potential groundwater contamination
- assess operating history for leaks and spills
- assess the site geo-hydrology
- assess the site program for radiological monitoring
- establish a voluntary communications protocol

Industry representatives discussed the short-term actions they expect to have in place by July 31, 2006 (i.e., Industry Action Plan) and the long-term items (i.e., installation of additional onsite and offsite groundwater monitoring wells, upgrades to structures, systems, and components, etc.) that will be described in the site-specific action plans, along with milestone dates for their implementation.

At the meeting, NEI provided the NRC staff with the "Industry Initiative on Groundwater Protection" (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML061910199) and a draft version of the "Industry Groundwater Protection Initiative, Voluntary Data Collection Questionnaire" (ADAMS Accession No. ML061910205). As a follow-up action to the meeting, NEI provided the NRC staff with an e-mail submitting more information on its Interim Industry Guidance for the Ground Water Protection Initiative (ADAMS Accession No. ML061950013). Attachments to the e-mail included the "Industry Ground Water Protection Action Plan Development, Interim Guidance Document - June 2006" (ADAMS Accession No. ML061950015) and the "Industry Ground Water Protection Voluntary Communication Protocol, Interim Guidance Document - June 2006" (ADAMS Accession No. ML061950017).

Members of the public were in attendance. Public Meeting Feedback forms were not received.
