Gentlemen:

This is to advise you of our compliance with your requirements in the shipment of eighteen (18) enriched uranium containing aluminum clad fuel elements to the Westinghouse Test Reactor. On December 16th units containing a total of 3600 grams of uranium were shipped via D. E. Makepeace Truck, Plainville, Massachusetts to Providence, Rhode Island; Associated Transport to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; Westinghouse truck to Waltz Mill, Pennsylvania, in shipping containers which have Bureau of Explosive permit and which have been approved by the Licensing Branch.

Further in compliance with your requirements, the trucking company has agreed to handle the shipment in accordance with your requirement that the containers not be co-mingled either in vehicles or at intermediate loading and transfer points with other radioactive materials containing shipments.

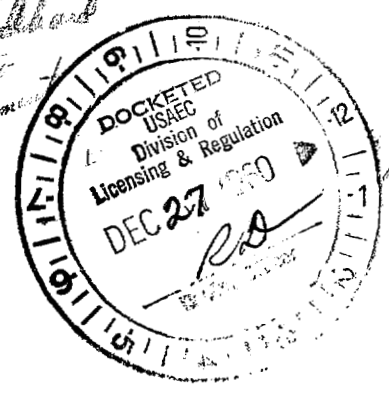

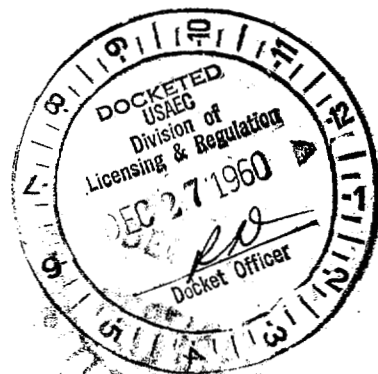
