1. The CBNC did not require a specified number of hours of training but suggested 50 hours. Some individuals had no hours but, based on the preceptor student attestation, were permitted to take the so called "exam". Is there any attempt by the NRC to determine if the "Authorized User" preceptor had actual training?

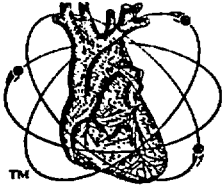

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
Re: Request for clarification
