Dear Mr. Shepherd:

Pursuant to the requirements of License SMB-911, Condition 37, FMRI submits the following information.

As you are aware, FMRI is planning to relocate bagged WIP material currently staged in Temporary Storage Areas (TSAs) to provide additional capacity for staging bags in the TSAs. The initial plan is to move the bags in Staging Area 2a into the Thermite Building (which is an impacted and bermed building). However, other impacted/bermed onsite buildings may also be used for this purpose (e.g., Chem A). In addition, FMRI may also stage newly bagged WIP material directly into an impacted/bermed building depending on project needs. Protective measures to the building floor(s) will be made according to established criteria.

Cook Construction will be assisting FMRI in this task of relocation and placement of bagged WIP material. Cook Construction has previously worked on site for the installation of the equipment for the recovery operation and for the installation of the facility interceptor trench.

To clarify FMRI's intent in the subject work plan to stage bagged WIP material inside impacted buildings, the FMRI definition of the, "...*temporary storage location for temporary storage prior to shipping*" provided in Section 3.0 (Material Processing) of the June 2005 Supplement Phase I Work Plan shall include the use of FMRI's impacted buildings.
