On August 1, 2006, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff participated in a teleconference call with USEC Inc. (USEC) to discuss clarifying information requested by the NRC staff concerning electrical and instrumentation & control portions of the USEC American Centrifuge Plant (ACP) license application (LA).

The focus of the teleconference was a request from NRC staff for USEC to include additional language in the ACP LA. On July 25, 2006, the NRC provided USEC the requested language which originated in USEC's request for additional information responses (see attachment). USEC responded to that request in a July 31, 2006, letter (AET 06-0090). The teleconference was requested to review the response and discuss any clarifications that were needed.

During the call, it was determined that USEC would add additional language to the responses to question 1 (Section 1.4.8 of the LA) and question 3 (Section 2.6.4 of the LA). USEC will accomplish this through various page revisions to the LA. For the remaining questions, the NRC staff understood USEC's response, but stated they will need to further evaluate the response before any sort of acceptance could be given. As the call ended, the NRC staff noted that additional information on the electrical and instrumentation & control portions of the LA may be needed before their review can be concluded.
