We have just returned from a Department of Energy (DOE) Cross-Country Transportation Working Group Meeting in Chicago, Illinois. As you are aware, this was a planning session on moving shipments of Foreign Spent Nuclear Fuel cross-country to Idaho. The DOE advised that the South Carolina portion of the route would be Savannah River Site, Highway 19 gate to the 118 by-pass around Alken back to Highway 19 and on to I-20, then west on I-20 to the South Carolina, Georgia state line.

This portion of the route is unacceptable to the law enforcement community. This would include SLED, DPS, and DNR on the state level as well as Aiken county authorities.

We would request the route be changed to the Highway 125 or Jackson gate to Beach Island then into Georgia on I-520. This route is more acceptable to the interface with the Georgia law enforcement group that is to escort the shipment according to Mr. Bruce Bragg of the Georgia Public Service Commission.

Our reasons for asking for this change are:

- 1. Ninetcen (19) miles shorter driving distance than the proposed route which may shorten transit time.
- 2. There are two (2) stoplights as opposed to approximately twenty-five (25) stoplights on the proposed route.
- 3. Less populated area of Aiken county and does not go near the Aiken county hospital and USC Aiken campus as does the proposed route.

- 4. It is all four (4) have divided highway as opposed to a majority of two (2) have ' road as does the proposed route.
- 5. It will better facilitate the security, safety and interface between South Carolina and Georgia authorities operations.
