NATIONAL SOURCE TRACKING

In the SRM for SECY-06-080, "Final Rule: National Source Tracking of Sealed Sources," dated May 25, 2006, the Commission directed the staff to provide an explanation of how it intends to transfer data from the Nuclear Materials Events Database (NMED) to the National Source Tracking System (NSTS) in a timely manner.

While the Commission paper (SECY-06-080) refers to NSTS's obtaining the information from either event reports or NMED, the NSTS will obtain information on lost or stolen sources directly from event reports, rather than searching through NMED, which would involve some delay. This means that the NSTS Project Manager or contractor would review event reports on a daily basis, for those involving lost or stolen sources, thus avoiding time delays and ensuring timely updates of information on the NSTS. This is the most direct and timely way to get the information into the system. The staff may use NMED as a quality check for data, but this would not involve a transfer of information between the systems.
