Dear Mr. Gamble:

By letter to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) dated May 5, 2006, Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) submitted an affidavit dated May 2, 2006, executed by you, requesting that the information contained in the following document be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 2, Section 2.390:

General Electric Company (GE) report GENE-0000-0053-7413-R0-P, "Browns Ferry Nuclear Plant Units 1, 2 and 3 Steam Dryer Stress, Dynamic and Fatigue Analyses for EPU Conditions," Revision 0, Class III (GE proprietary Information), May 2006

The information was contained in Enclosure 4 to TVA's letter dated May 5, 2006. A nonproprietary copy of this document has been placed in the NRC's Public Document Room and added to the Agencywide Documents Access and Management System Public Electronic Reading Room.

The affidavit stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure for the following reasons:

- a. Information that discloses a process, method, or apparatus, including supporting data and analyses, where prevention of its use by General Electric's competitors without license from General Electric constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies.
- b. Information which, if used by a competitor, would reduce his expenditure of resources or improve his competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality, or licensing of a similar product.

We have reviewed your application and the material in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390 and, on the basis of your statements, have determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure.

You also should understand that the NRC may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information.
