

The CI is concerned about contractor supervisors who turn their heads when certain individuals come in half blitzed.

EICS NOTE: OI agreed to pursue the issue regarding whether an individual who self reported that s/he smelled of alcohol and was not FFD tested involved the same individuals and circumstances as referenced in the concern. See security's review of licensee investigation report and 03/25/02 ARB in RIII-2002-A-0042.

**Basis for Closure**

An investigator from the RIII Office of Investigations initiated an investigation on 3/25/02 to determine if (1) welders failed to report FFD concern about their foreman; (2) to determine if the foremen deliberately failed to submit to FFD testing; and (3) whether a superintendent provided false information to the licensee investigation concerning the foreman

Based on the evidence developed during the investigation, the investigator did not substantiate that (1) welders failed to report FFD concern about their foreman (2) that the foremen deliberately failed to submit to FFD testing. However the investigator did substantiate that the superintendent (3) deliberately failed to report a FFD concern and (4) provided false information to the both OI and the licensee investigators.


This concern was closed because: (1) the issue will be addressed through the enforcement process; (2) an enforcement coordinator will provide the OI synopsis to the licensee; and (3) this concern is anonymous which means a closure letter is not required.
