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SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: For the record, this is an interview of who is a welder who was formerly employed by Day & Zimmerman Nuclear Power Systems at the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Station. Today's date's August 5th, 2002. The time is approximately noon. This interview is being conducted in the Executive Board Room at the Radisson Hotel, 2040 Airport Drive, Green Bay, Wisconsin. My name is Mary Kay Fahey. I'm a special agent with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Office of Investigations in Region III. This interview is being transcribed by court reporter Carrie Bohrer.

The subject matter of this interview is a fitness-for-duty concern at the Kewaunee Nuclear Power Station during a refuel outage in 2001.

Mr. please raise your right hand.

was called as a witness and, having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified as follows:

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: How about some

background information. Date of birth?



SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And Social

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: What was your

position?



Welder.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And the reason

you're no longer employed there?

They had a layoff.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: So the work was

completed?



Work was completed.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. And this

work was during an outage?



Yes.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. And we --

When we were off the record before we started, you mentioned that you have had some subsequent problems

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SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: -- that

was working out there --

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-- at Point Beach.

_ SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: -- at Point Beach?

And had you applied there?

MR. I had called them to see about getting a job, and that's when they had told me that I was denied. Somehow they knew it before I did.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. Now we're going to get to that, but I'd like to talk chronologically if we can about the problems during the outage, and then we'll wrap it up with your problems in getting hired today at NMC plants. Okay. When you were hired for the outage at Kewaunee in 2001, did you go through general employee training upon arrival?



SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. And do you recall during that training whether fitness for duty was discussed?



Yes, it was.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. Do you

remember being tested on that?



Yes, I did.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Did you pass the

test?



Yep.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. And tell me

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Do you remember

from -- in passing. He worked for Day & Zimmerman, but I was in the maintenance department, and he was with the construction guys.

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: All right. Tell me about how it is that you came into contact with him and subsequently reported him, and why did you report him?

MR Well, I was visiting the boys in the back, and he was the -- he was the foreman there, and you could smell, you know, alcohol on him. I don't know if he was drunk or not, but you could smell alcohol.

I did it on my own. And come to find out, they had done it themselves. We had both done it on the same day. They done it prior to myself, because I had -- was coming through the maintenance shop, and that's when I had stopped and told him about | smelling of alcohol.

your -- the response that you got?



He said he would look into

it, and that's far as it went, was right there, because we

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figured you tell him, he's going to take care of the problem, and I didn't see panymore that day, so I 2 3 just took it as he took care of the problem. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And do you know 4 for a fact whether was tested that day? 5 Do not know if he was or not. 6 7 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: How long did your conversation with 8 Not very long. That was it. 10 minutes. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. Other than 11 12 the smell, did you have any other interaction with 13 14 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: 15 So you didn't 16 observe any slurred speech, stumbling, anything that --17 No. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: 18 Okay. But if -- you know, if the . 19 other fellows here, you know, like myself and 20 21 we smelled it, you would think the supervisor -- the other 22 supervisors would have smelled it also, because they're all in the same room together. And the fellow, 23 24 rode to work with him.

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And he was one of

the supervisors? 1 And he was one of the 2 3 supervisors also. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And when 4 Okay. 5 did you subsequently find out that 6 had also reported? 7 MR. Because I seen a not long after that, and I mentioned to 8 that I told him, and 9 he had said that he had just told him himself previous that morning. 10 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Did 11 12 give you any indication anybody else had already reported 13 the issue? 14 15 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. And is that 16 the end of it? And that was --17 18 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: That's the last 19 you heard of it? 20 That was the last I heard of 21 it. 22 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: But then the issue resurfaced? 23 24 Yes, it did. 25 And when was that? SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY:

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It resurfaced in December. 1 2 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. And this is after the outage is completed? 3 4 That was after the outage is 5 complete. 6 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: You had been laid off. 7 I was laid off. 8 9 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Were you working 10 at the time? 11 No. 12 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Had you attempted to get employment anywhere in December? 13 Not at that moment, no. 14 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: 15 Okay. 16 I was enjoying the time off. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: All right. 17 who -- how did it resurface? 18 19 I had an NMC investigator 20 call me and wanted to investigate me about some problems of some welding that was going on. I told him no problem, 21 he -- I'd talk to you about it. And he said it was just 22 confidential between him and I and the fence post. 23 was it. It was just informational only. So then he was 24

asking about all the welding, and next thing you know he

25

1 asked me if I knew about a fellow that smelled of alcohol. That was my mistake; I said "yes." Because the rest of 2 them -- got plenty of others that didn't -- they said they 3 didn't know nothing of it. They didn't lose their access. 4 5 Seems like the ones that admitted to knowing of it lost access. 6 7 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. What did you tell the investigator? 8 Well, when -- you know, it 9 was just -- he said, "It's just you and I talking, just 10 11 say" -- and that's when he asked me if I knew about it, I 12 said "yes." He says, "Well, did anybody else know about it?" I said, "All the supervisors had to know." And that 13 That was the end of it. He didn't ask no more 14 15 questions, went right back onto the weld maps. He didn't ask me if I talked to anybody about it, if -- he only 16 asked if I knew about it. 1.7 18 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Now, when you left 19 the plant, did this investigator contact you at home? 20 Yes. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Did you meet with 21 22 him in person or over the phone? In person. 23

SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Do you know whether others were contacted around the same time?

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Yes, they were. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And did you have 2 conversations with other people about it? 3 4 No. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: How did you know 5 that they were --6 7 He said he was investigating everybody who was working for the maintenance over there, 8 the maintenance and the construction, and he was --9 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: So the 10 investigator told you -11 12 Yeah, he said he was 13 investigating everyone. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: 14 15 ever contact you? 16 No. Did 17 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: ever contact you? 18 19 No. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: You haven't spoken 20 with either of them since you left? 21 Neither one of them. 22 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. And did you 23 ever hear anything back from the investigator, what the 24 outcome of the investigation was? 25

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SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And the licensee

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sent you that letter?

11	history of working for NMC?
12	MR. Well
13	SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Or was the
14	Kewaunee outage your first
15	MR. No, I worked for them at
16	Point Beach, for six to eight months prior.
17	SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay.
18	MR. Ever how long I was over at
19	Kewaunee is how long I I mean at Point Beach is how
20.	long I worked for them.
21	SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Couple of years?
22	MR Well, throughout the whole
23	thing. First it was Phillip & Getschow that had the
24	then it was Williams Power, then Day Zimmerman took over.

So he didn't blow anything, but 2 the other maintenance -- I was working in the maintenance 3 4 group there, and the other maintenance employees knew he smelled of alcohol and knew it wasn't the first time. 5 6 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. 7 really doesn't matter whether --8 Right. 9 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: -- he tested 10 positive or not, 11 He tested --12 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: -- the process 13 worked? 14 Right. They had tested him 15 and it worked. I didn't get in trouble. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And that's the 16 whole point of the program? 17 18 MR. Right. 19 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: That if you 20 suspect, that the employee goes along with the program? 21 (Nods head affirmatively.) 22 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. Have you 23 done anything else in an attempt to get your access back? 24 Hired an attorney, gone to the Department of Labor, any 25 other avenues?







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Today you recall specifically --2 3 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: -- and you recall a specific day, but you can't give me the date? 4 5 Right. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And it was a day 6 7 in which said he would take care of it -- or look into it? 8 Look into it. 9 10 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And it was a day 11 that you recall that Mr. also mentioned --12 SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: 13 Also mentioned the same day? 14 15 Same day. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. All right. 16 And the investigator wrote, and I'm going to quote this 17 because I want you to explain this: "Mr. responded 18 that he did not notify Day Zimmerman Nuclear Power 19 Service, " NPS, it says, "management of Mr. 20 condition because they knew his condition and because he, 21 22 was a fellow worker." 

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asking -- calling Randy Cleveland, what's going on, and he kept saying, We're investigating, investigating, and --2 3 and they sent me a denial again. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: And do you 4 remember when that was? 5 6 That was in April, I believe. 7 Yeah, I think it was in the end of April. I think that's 8 it. SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. All right. 9 10 Let's go off the record one more time. 11 (Discussion off the record.) SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: Okay. We're back 12 on the record. While we were off the record I provided 13 you with Jim Heller's telephone number. He's our 14 allegations coordinator in Region III. And I discussed 15 with you in general terms about making an allegation of 16 17 discrimination and what little information I know about the Department of Labor's program. Mr. Heller certainly 18 can provide you with much more detailed information, and 19 you said while we were off the record that you're going to 20 think about it. 21 22 Yes. And you'll contact SPECIAL AGENT FAHEY: 23 Mr. Heller if you decide you want to go one way or the 24 25 other?


