Dear Mr. Maxand:

This letter acknowledges the receipt of your letter dated September 5, 2006, in which you request a public meeting for the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to provide an update on the status of NRC's review of the Department of Energy's (DOE's) draft waste determination for the Idaho Nuclear Technology and Engineering Center (INTEC) Tank Farm Facility (TFF) tank closure activities. In addition, you request that this meeting address the role of the NRC in monitoring DOE's disposal actions and how NRC and the Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (IDEQ) will coordinate activities related to this and other cleanup efforts at INTEC.

Under Section 3116 of the Ronald W. Reagan National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005 (NDAA), DOE is required to consult with NRC in determining that certain radioactive waste resulting from its reprocessing of spent nuclear fuel is not high-level waste. NRC staff has prepared a Technical Evaluation Report (TER) that documents NRC's review of DOE's draft waste determination for the INTEC TFF and presents the staff's analysis and findings. The TER is currently in the final stages of NRC's internal review and will likely be issued later this month.

NRC has a policy of openness and believes that stakeholders should be appropriately informed of NRC processes and activities. Once the TER has been issued, we would happy to meet with you and other interested stakeholders to discuss the results of NRC's review, planned monitoring activities, and future interactions with DOE and IDEQ. I will contact you once the TER has been issued to discuss the timing, location, and format for this meeting.
