Summary: I told Mr. Santarsiero that I was calling for more information regarding the fax he sent - that more detail is needed in order to determine if a meeting is really necessary. He stated that he thought he provided sufficient detail, but answered my questions.

He has "many" questions about license renewals which were recently issued, regarding conditions which were "imposed" on the license which he cannot meet. He could only think of two examples at this time: the -14 license requires that "the licensee" perform a physical inventory of all sealed sources every 6 months; however he stated that the sources are distributed at facilities across the world and the radiation safety staff cannot perform a physical inventory. I informed him that the radiation safety staff is not the licensee, and that the inventory can be performed by those who possess the sources as authorized by the -14 license (this is a broad scope license). He also stated that this license authorizes use only at the Ft. Monmouth location and any DOD installations in the US; however, they use them at bases around the world. I informed him that we do not have jurisdiction around the world. I said I would check similar Army licenses to see if the wording was different, and that he should check with John Manfree at AMC as well. He could not remember other questions. I told him that these types of questions could easily be answered by telephone.

He said that he also wished to discuss the Army going to one single license, similar to the Navy. When I asked him if he was officially representing AMC in this issue, he said no, but that he would inform John Manfree prior to the meeting that he would be discussing this with us. I told him that we needed to know beforehand, if we would be dealing with the proper licensing group --- that based on past conversations with Manfree, we expected to be dealing with AMC on this issue, not with individual licensees. We are willing to discuss a master materials license, but need to know that we are dealing with the proper Army representatives who will be making decisions on this issue. He said he would talk to Manfree.

He also stated that he wants to discuss the closure of bases and decommissioning of those facilities. His current commander has been charged with coordinating these activities with the Army environmental Hygiene Agency (AEHA). Again I told him that we can discuss specific decon criteria etc by telephone. He believes he has more generic concerns but couldn't describe them at the moment.

Action Required/Taken: 1) determine if someone is available to observe/pickup samples. 2) contact RWTF to confirm this information 3) file in docket folder for review at next inspection.

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<p>Summary: PAGE 2 OF 2</p> <p>I told him that, if he wants to meet here, it could be arranged, but that he needs to describe in more detail what topics he wants to discuss, so that we have the right technical and management representatives available. Also, we need to know what level of management will be attending the meeting from the Army. I informed him that such a meeting would be open to the public, and a Meeting Notice would be issued, so we have to be prepared for the issues to be discussed. He hoped that an informal meeting would be possible, since his office is located so close.</p> <p>I asked him about the statement on his fax regarding decommissioning funding, but he had no specific questions at the moment. He plans to send a letter with specific questions about his recent amendments and would like a response in writing. He will also, probably in the same letter, provide more detail requesting information about a master license and decommissioning/release of facilities as bases close, and the decommissioning finding plan, and will request a meeting. He asked if about our organizations, and I explained Bellamy/Shanbaky/Ullrich and why he is talking to me at this time. He will continue to contact me if he has questions. He will address his letter to Bellamy or Shanbaky.</p>
