We wish to amend our license 52-01986-04 to remove the use of Sr-90 and Kr-85 as authorized isotopes. As stated in our letter from October 25, 2005, the use of these isotopes was requested to utilize aerosol neutralizers at a temporary job site, in a collaborative project by Dr. Olga Mayol, from our campus, and Dr. Johannes Schneider, from the Max Planck Institute for Chemistry, Germany. The site was inspected by the RSO, Dr. Fernando Renaud, during December, 2006, to ascertain that the rules and the leak test had been performed, and that the results were negative. Following completion of the work, the equipment was shipped to Germany, and therefore at present we do not have S-90 or Kr-85 in any form, nor do we intend to use these isotopes in the foreseeable future.
