Description of Event: On February 10, 2007, at about 5:30 a.m., BP Pipelines and Tracerco were in the process of recovering a pipeline "utility pig" (containing ~ 3.8 millicuries of Tantalum-182 in the form of a metal wire) from its subsea pipeline using a remotely operated vehicle (ROV), when the ROV lost control of the pig. The pig floated to the ocean surface (~5,000 ft.), and its location is not known, nor was the pig recovered after BP searched for the pig for some 10 hours on Saturday 2/10/2007.
