Enclosed is Amendment No. 73 to your NRC Material License No. 13-06009-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

Your letter dated February 5, 2007, requested the deletion of authorization for the HDR device listed in Subitem Nos. 6 through 9I. In order for us to approve the deletion of this authorization please submit one of the following written responses, addressed to my attention and reference it as "additional information to control number 315838":

1. If the HDR device in Subitem Nos. 6 through 9I. was never installed or used in your facility, please so state. Or,
2. If the HDR device in Subitem Nos. 6 through 9I. was used or installed in your facility, please indicate the last date of use and provide either a copy of the last leak test performed on the sealed source prior to that use date or provide a copy of an appropriate survey (wipe tests and direct dose rate surveys) to demonstrate that no residual contamination was left behind in the area of use. If you need further advice on what to include in the "close-out survey" option, please contact me at either 630-829-9841 or 800-522-3025, ext. 9841 to discuss this further.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with 10 CFR 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
