a. Supplement A - Human Use (qualifications and training) is submitted for Colonel William Butz. Supplement A has not been submitted on three additional named users.

b. Officers or individuals should not certify himself as preceptor in item 12, Supplement A.

c. Training or experience is not documented for users in case of Iron 59.


d. Proposed uses, dosages, and user training or experience are not documented for tritium.

2. Your attention is invited to AR 40-37, "Radioisotope License Program (Human Use)" dated 12 August 1963 attached as inclosure hereto. It is recommended that your program be revised as nearly as possible to reflect conformity with this regulation.

3. Your attention is further invited to the fact that this application was submitted as a renewal. You are advised that coordination has been accomplished with the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission to authorize a 90 day extension to your current license pending revision and resubmission of an application in its entirety to reflect your current needs and institute procedures that conform to AR 40-37.
