Inclosed are ten (10) copies of USAELRDL Memorandum Number 385-5, which is currently being used in the Laboratories as a guide for the prevention and control of radiation hazards.

Memorandum Number 385-5, dated 17 February 1964, supersedes Memorandum Number 385-5, dated 27 January 1961, and contains several important changes which will enable the Laboratories to maintain greater control over radio-isotopes and ionizing radiation. The changes were made after a lengthy study of previous operating procedures by members of the Isotopes Committee and the users themselves.

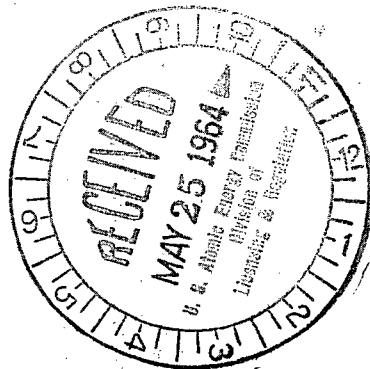
