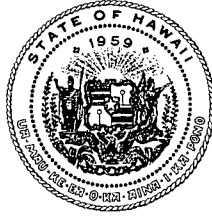
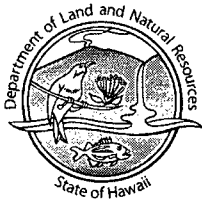

We are in receipt of your letter to Mr. Michael Kohn of Pa‘ina Hawai‘I, LLC, and the aforementioned draft environmental assessment. We received these documents on January 12, 2007.

We have previously commented (LOG NO: 2005.2653, DOC NO: 0512DB02) on the proposed installation of an irradiator at the subject location and found that the undertaking would have “no effect” on historically-significant resources. We continue to believe that the proposed undertaking will have “no effect” on historically-significant resources.

However, in the unlikely event that historic properties, including human remains, are encountered during routine construction activities, all work in the vicinity must stop immediately and the State Historic Preservation Division must be contacted at (808) 692-8015.
