Fitness for Duty Program Six Month Performance Report July – December 2006

PROGRAM SUMMARY:

The Waterford 3 annual random testing rate is 50 percent. During this reporting period, approximately 26.4 percent of the population has been randomly tested. The rate of positive tests from random testing is 0.31 percent. The total random percentage for the year is 54.2 percent.

POSITIVE RESULTS:

As shown on the attached sheets, there were three positive tests during this reporting period. The samples that confirmed positive for Marijuana were confirmed at the NRC cut-off of 100 ng/ml.

MANAGEMENT ACTIONS:

During this reporting period, six for-cause tests were requested. Four were requested because of accidents. All samples returned negative results. One was requested due to a smell of alcohol and one due to smell of marijuana. Both samples returned negative results.

Two contractors tested positive during pre-access testing, and one contractor tested positive during random testing. Management was notified, and the individuals' access requests were denied or revoked. The files were annotated to reflect the positive results and denials of access.

One sample collected from a contractor during pre-access testing was suspect due to low temperature. A second sample was requested. The individual left without completing the second collection. This was classified as refusal to test. The Medical Review Officer and management were notified. The individual's access was denied, and his folder was annotated to reflect the refusal and denial of access. The original sample was tested and returned negative results.

Three follow-up samples were collected from licensee employees, and eight were collected from contractors during this reporting period. All samples returned negative results.

A condition report was issued due to the time frame from collection of the pre-access sample until the date badged having exceeded thirty days. A sample was collected at that time from the contractor involved. This sample was categorized as 'Other' because the reason for collection did not fit into any of the established categories.

Fitness for Duty Program Six Month Performance Report

One sample that was collected for random testing leaked during shipment to the laboratory. A second sample was collected and will be included in the next reporting period.

EVENTS REPORTED TO THE NRC:

During this reporting period, there were no violations of the fitness for duty program that were reportable.

PROGRAM EVALUATION:

No programmatic problems were identified during this reporting period.
