Hairy Honeysuckle *Lonicera hirsuta*

Name, French:	Chèvrefeuille hirsute
Name, Other:	
Natural Habitat:	Dry or moist areas, gravelly or rocky woods, thickets, slopes, clearings, swampy or mossy woods.
Tree Form:	Trailing or high-climbing vine.
Size At Maturity:	Shrub 3 m high 10 feet
Light Requirement:	
Water Requirement: (scale of 1-5)	
Wildlife:	Fruit is of limited use to wildlife but hares eat the twigs.
Notes:	Orange to yellow, narrowly tubular flowers above saucer-like fused leaves; orange-red berries in stalked clusters. Grows best in acid soil.
