## APPLICANT'S PRE-FILED TESTIMONY CONCERNING HEARING TOPIC HTS-3 (LICENSE CONDITIONS)

- Q1. Please state your name, current position, and by whom you are employed.
- A1. My name is Peter J. Miner ("PJM"). My current position is Director, Regulatory and Quality Assurance for the American Centrifuge Plant ("ACP"). My current employer is USEC Inc. ("USEC" or "Applicant").
- A1. My name is Gregory S. Corzine ("GSC"). My current position is Nuclear Safety Manager for the ACP. My current employer is USEC Inc.
- A1. My name is Mark D. Smith ("MDS"). My current position is Manager of NuclearLicensing. My current employer is USEC Inc.
- A1. My name is John C. Barpoulis ("JCB"). My current position is Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer for USEC Inc.
- A1. My name is Donald J. Hatcher ("DJH"). My current position is Director of RiskManagement. My current employer is USEC Inc.
- Q2. Please describe your professional qualifications.

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- A2. (PJM) I hold a Master of Science degree in Environmental, Safety and Health Management from the University of Findlay, and a Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics from the University of Massachusetts. A statement of my professional qualifications is provided in USEC Exhibit # 1.
- A2. (GSC) I hold Bachelor of Science (1985) and Master of Science (1988) degrees in Nuclear Engineering from University of Cincinnati. I have been employed by USEC Inc. since June of 2003. I have over 18 years of experience in the nuclear power and nuclear fuel cycle industries. A statement of my professional qualifications is provided in USEC Exhibit # 1.
- A2. (MDS) I hold a Bachelor of Science degree in Nuclear Engineering from Iowa State University, and a Master of Engineering degree in Engineering Science from the Pennsylvania State University. I have been employed by USEC Inc., since 1996. I have over 26 years of experience in the nuclear industry. A statement of my professional qualifications is provided in USEC Exhibit # 1.
- A2 (JCB) I hold a Bachelor of Arts degree in Physics from Vassar College, a Bachelor of Engineering degree in Mechanical Engineering from the Thayer School of Engineering at Dartmouth College, and a Master of Business Administration degree from the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth College. A statement of my professional qualifications is provided in USEC Exhibit # 1.
- A2. (DJH) I hold a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Bethel
   College, and designation of Associate in Risk Management from the Insurance Institute
   of America. I have been employed by USEC Inc. since 1995. A statement of my
   professional qualifications is provided in USEC Exhibit # 1.

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- Q3. On whose behalf are you testifying?
- A3. (PJM, GSC, MDS, JCB, DJH) I am testifying on behalf of the Applicant, USEC Inc.
- Q4. Please describe your involvement in the ACP License Application.
- A4. (PJM) I am USEC Inc.'s Director, Regulatory and Quality Assurance for the ACP.
- A4. (GSC) I am USEC's Nuclear Safety Manager for the ACP.
- A4. (MDS) I am the Applicant's regulatory lead for decommissioning planning activities associated with the ACP.
- A4. (JCB) I oversee the financial activities of the corporation, including accounting, treasury, financial and strategic planning, tax, risk management, procurement and investor relations.
- A4. (DJH) I am responsible for working with USEC Inc.'s insurance broker and American Nuclear Liability Insurers on matters related to nuclear liability insurance for the ACP.
- Q5. Please describe your responsibilities with respect to the ACP License Application?
- A5. (PJM) I served as Project Manager for the development of the ACP License Application, Integrated Safety Analysis (ISA), Environmental Report, and supporting documents. I have provided coordination and oversight of development activities for technical subjects, drafted inputs to various functional areas, and reviewed and edited the documents. I also coordinated the development of the Applicant's responses to requests for additional information ("RAIs") from the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC").
- A5. (GSC) As Nuclear Safety Manager, I was responsible for developing and maintaining the ACP Integrated Safety Analysis ("ISA"). I oversaw initial development of the ACP ISA and the ACP License Application chapters addressing the ISA, Fire Safety, and Nuclear

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Criticality. Also, I oversaw development of certain USEC responses to RAIs issued by the NRC with respect to the ACP License Application.

- A5. (MDS) I was responsible for preparation of Chapter 10 (Decommissioning) of the ACP License Application and the associated Decommissioning Funding Plan. I also was responsible for providing input for responses to NRC RAIs regarding decommissioning. I was also a member of the Applicant's Strategy/Approval Review Team that was responsible for review of the License Application prior to NRC submittal.
- A5. (JCB) I oversee company financial activities related to the proposed ACP, including accounting, treasury, financial and strategic planning, tax, risk management, procurement and investor relations activities.
- A5. (DJH) I am responsible for working with USEC's insurance broker and American Nuclear Liability Insurers to assess potential nuclear liability insurance options for the proposed ACP.
- Q6. In an Order (Establishing a Modified Case Schedule; Issuing Questions and Identifying Hearing Topics) of February 6, 2007, the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board ("ASLB") identified a series of hearing topics on which the Board has required testimony and presentations from the NRC Staff. The Staff submitted its pre-filed testimony on March 5, 2007. *See* "NRC Staff Testimony Related to HTS-3: License Conditions" (March 5, 2007). Have you reviewed the Staff's testimony regarding Hearing Topic HTS-3?
  A6. (BIM CSC MDS JCB DIH) Year

A6. (PJM, GSC, MDS, JCB, DJH) Yes.

Q7. In its February 6, 2007, Order, the ASLB expressly authorized the Applicant to submit supplemental pre-filed testimony for the purpose of clarifying and/or supplementing the

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Staff's pre-filed testimony. See February 6 Order at 3 n.4. Do you wish to provide any supplemental testimony at this time with respect to HTS-3?

(PJM, GSC, MDS, JCB, DJH) No. We concur in the Staff's testimony regarding this A7. hearing topic. We are prepared, however, to respond orally to any questions germane to HTS-3 that the Board directs to the Applicant during the evidentiary hearing.
