During the original construction phase Augusta-Richmond County was able to accommodate a large portion of the construction work force with relatively few problems. Our regulations are tighter now, and we might have to address the issue of temporary housing because there is less area available for mobile home development. Our roadway connection to the site, specifically Mike Padgett Hwy (GA 56), is much better than it was during the original construction and no problem is anticipated. Our public facilities, including hospitals, all have adequate capacity to handle the influx of construction workers. Augusta-Richmond County supports and looks forward to the construction of the new reactors.

Subject: Vogtle Nuclear Plant Expansion

Dear Mr. DeCamp,

I am working with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to evaluate the recent application to expand the Vogtle Nuclear Plant, located down river from you. As part of the application process, we complete an environmental impact statement that assesses both environmental and economic impacts on the region. During the expansion of the plant, there will be the need for a few thousand construction workers to complete this expansion. Although none of this construction would take place in Richmond County, I was just wanting to touch base with someone familiar with planning in your area to make sure that we appropriately assess all various impacts. As part of the impact statement we are presuming that a number of the construction workers may temporarily be relocating to the Augusta area and/or may be drawn from the existing pool of construction workers in the area.

One of the things I was wondering is how you might go about addressing major construction events as part of your planning, in general. For example, if a hospital in your county was planning on some major construction, do you only address the land-use issues involved with the construction of this facility, or do you consider any of the impacts of temporarily housing the construction workforce? If so, are there any rules of thumb or experiences that we might draw from to assess some of the construction impacts of the Vogtle nuclear plant? Are there any transportation issues that would arise from a construction event taking place in a neighboring county? In general, I just wonder if you have any concerns or any planning issues that you would like to raise regarding the future construction and operation of two new reactors at the Vogtle Nuclear plant. Although it operates in Burke County, approximately 26% of the employees of the plant live in Richmond County.

If you think that you are not the person who should (or would want to) respond to these types of questions and you have someone else in mind that would be more appropriate for me to contact, please let me

know. There will be a team of NRC personnel and supporting staff in the area on week of October 16th for a site audit, and we would be happy to meet with anyone to discuss Vogtle impacts/issues if need be. Thanks.
