As a follow up to our conversation today, the following is an account of circumstances regarding the discovery of the nuclear density box and machine we had missing.

While at the Big Cypress site on Friday May 11, 2007. I was advised by Gary Davis of R2T that he had received a call the previous evening from Skip Walker, a site superintendent with KDL Construction. Skip had informed Gary that he had run into someone that had found a density box and machine recently and thought it might be the one we were missing. Gary advised him that I would be at the site the next day and to bring it over.

Later that day, Skip came by and brought the box and machine. We opened the box and found the machine to be intact. Skip explained to me that he was out looking to buy an airboat in an area called Montura Estates (not sure of spelling) and was speaking to a person who indicated he had found the box in the area of the intersection of SR 80 and US 27. Skip mentioned that he knew we had one missing and figured it might be the one that was ours. I thanked him and brought the box back to our Tampa office and asked Chris DiViccaro, our company RSO, to call and report it was found.
