SKY Project

Dear Mr. Camper:

This submittal informs the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) that Strathmore Resources, U.S., Ltd. (Strathmore) intends to submit a license application for a uranium In-Situ Recovery (ISR) operations facility to be located in Fremont County, Wyoming at its SKY Project. The property is located about 25 miles southeast of Riverton and 31 miles southeast of Lander in Sections 35, T32N R95W and Sections 1 and 2, T31N R95W. It consists of unpatented mining claims covering approximately 1000 acres of land owned by the federal government and administered by the Bureau of Land Management.

Strathmore has begun performing certain studies in support of the environmental assessment that will support the license application, including the cultural and archaeological resources assessment and the flora and fauna studies at SKY. Initial drilling, coring and baseline groundwater characterization activities are planned for and summer, 2007. Data collection will continue for at least a year from this spring for those environmental factors that require determination of annual variations. Strathmore has also begun preparation of the ISR facility design basis document. Submittal of the license application to the NRC is anticipated in mid to late FY 09.

We have scheduled a "side-bar" meeting with NRC's staff during the upcoming National Mining Association/NRC meeting in Denver on May 14 to further discuss this project. We look forward to working with the NRC staff. Please contact me or John DeJoia our Vice President of Technical Affairs if you have any questions or require additional information.
