To Whom It May Concern:

In response to the letter dated May 18, 2007 for an inspection conducted on April 26, 2007, at a temporary job site in Midwest, Wyoming against Nebraska License 02-46-01 two Severity Level IV violations for NRC requirements occurred. The following are the corrective actions for these violations:

1. Contrary to 10 CFR 34.89(b)(2) copies of 10 CFR parts 19, 20 and 34 of the NRC regulations were not maintained at the time of the inspection.
 - a. The radiographer was informed by the Radiation Safety Officer as to what documents needed to be maintained for a temporary job site. The radiographer was asked to verify that all required documents for the temporary jobsite were located in the radiography truck.
 - b. The radiographer failed to follow DBI, Inc.'s Operating and Emergency procedures for reciprocity.
 - c. The NRC regulations for 10 CFR parts 19, 20 and 34 were immediately made available to the radiographer on the same day as the inspection. The radiographer and the assistant radiographer were retrained on May 15, 2007 as to what documents are required to be maintained at a temporary jobsite.

2. Contrary to 10 CFR 34.47 (b) for reading and recording exposures at the beginning and end of each shift, were not maintained.
 - a. The radiographer and assistant radiographer were trained on how to properly fill out the appropriate paperwork including documentation of their exposure.
 - b. The radiographer and assistant radiographer failed to follow DBI, Inc.'s Operating and Emergency procedures.
 - c. The radiographer and assistant radiographer were retrained on May 15, 2007 on how to properly complete all required paperwork. The radiographer was reminded that it was his responsibility for overseeing the radiography operations.
