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National Historic Preservation Act of 1966

NHPA sets forth a

- National policy,
- Broad philosophy, and
- Framework for decision-making

Section 106 of NHPA

- Implementing regulations are codified at 36 CFR Part 800
- Section 106 of NHPA requires that all Federal agencies consider historic properties as part of their decision-making and calls for an advisory review of all federal undertakings

Environmental Reports

- NRC Regulations
 - 10 CFR 51.53(c)(3)(ii)(K)
All applicants shall assess whether any historic or archaeological properties will be affected by the proposed action
- Guidance
 - Regulatory Guide 4.2, Supplement 1

NRC Staff Reviews

- NRC Regulations
 - 10 CFR 51.71(d) and 51.95(c)
- Guidance
 - Environmental Standard Review Plan, Supplement 1
 - Sections 3.6.6 and 4.4.5

NRC Site Audit

- Staff reviews:
 - Environmental report
 - Pre-construction, construction, and post construction photos
 - Cultural resource investigations/surveys
 - Consultation correspondence
 - Site disturbance maps
 - Maps (non-public) detailing locations of sites or historic structures
 - Cultural resource protection procedures

NRC Site Audit

- An NRC staff review also involves:
 - Observing historic and archaeological sites
 - Interviewing responsible facility personnel
 - Meeting with SHPO staff members to discuss the proposed action
 - Conducting a site file search at the State historic preservation office
 - Meeting with local preservation officials in the project area

Key Messages

- Early applicant coordination with SHPO
 - Share cultural protection procedures
 - Facilitates efficient staff review
