




Groundwater Contamination

 Licensees Must Control, Monitor, and Evaluate all Radiological Effluents Discharged to the Environment







Public Radiation Dose (millirem/year)




GW Contamination Significance


- Public dose small fraction of limits; Indian Point with 2 leaking SFPs = 0.012 mrem bone dose and 0.003 mrem total body (0.12% and 0.1% of NRC liquid effluent limits)
- Background (est.) 360 mrem / yr (NCRP 94)
- Public Dose Limits 100 mrem / yr (10CFR20.1301)
 25 mrem/yr from NPPs (40CFR190)
