This is my trip report on participating in the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) consultancy to develop an Implementation Guide for the use of the newly issued ISO Standard, "Ionizing radiation warning - Supplementary Symbol" (ISO 21482). The Guide would be of interest to the Commission because the document makes recommendations for the placement of the warning symbol on devices containing IAEA Category 1, 2, and 3 sources. The use of the symbol was addressed both for new and retro-fit devices. The Guide is planned to be published as a "Working Material," not subject to the customary approval process of IAEA, and the date of publication and the distribution was still to be determined at the time of the Consultancy. The Office of International Programs issued a Note to the Commissioner Assistants, dated June 4, 2007. Due to the significance of the new warning symbol, the unique classification and approval process of the document and the Commission's previous interest on this topic, the Division of Materials Safety and State Agreements recommends that the Office of International Programs forward the report to the Commission.
