To Whom it May Concern,

CORAR* has been working closely with the NRC staff on the revisions made to the regulations for the inclusion of accelerator-produced radioactive material to the regulations made as a result of the EPAct of 2005, and have provided a great deal of feedback. We are pleased to see draft NUREG 1556 Volume 21 "Consolidated Guidance About Materials Licenses—Program-Specific Guidance About Possession Licenses for Production of Radioactive Material Using an Accelerator" come from the staff. However, we do not believe 30 days is an adequate amount of time for the industry to review this draft and get comments back to the NRC, particularly with a new volume. We have also discussed our concern with the Society of Nuclear Medicine, the American College of Nuclear Physicians and the National Association of Nuclear Pharmacists. Those organizations share our concern with the short review time, and feel an extended comment period would provide an opportunity to furnish better comments to the NRC.

CORAR requests an extension of the comment period to 90 days for NUREG 1556 Volume 1556, and all additional NUREG 1556 volumes that will be proposed by the NRC. We believe a 90 day comment period will afford adequate time to submit meaningful comments. We also believe the

time spent in a longer industry review time of these NUREGs, will offset any delayed publication of the final NUREG.
