SUBJECT: REPLY TO A NOTICE OF VIOLATION

To Whom It May Concern:

Pursuant to the provisions of 10 CFR 2.201, please consider this as our response to the one violation of NRC requirements that was identified during the NRC inspection of our facilities on June 6, 2007.

During the inspection, it was noted that the shipping documents used for transporting the nuclear density device to local construction projects contained incorrect information. More specifically, the letters – "RQ" were not shown in the shipping name column and the Arabic numeral "2" was shown in the category column, instead of "Yellow II". The mistake occurred due to a misunderstanding and when a new supervisor, not familiar with the files, inadvertently pulled an outdated form from a file and duplicated it for future use.

Immediately following the NRC inspection, the shipping form was revised in accordance with our discussions with the NRC Inspector. The capitalized letters – "RQ" were inserted into the proper shipping name column following UN3332 and the Arabic numeral "2" was replaced with "Yellow II" in the category column.

All copies of outdated shipping documents that were on hand have been discarded and all files that used the old form have been archived to preclude an old form from being used in the future.

Shipping documents were brought into full compliance immediately following the NRC inspection, effective June 6, 2007.

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Should any additional information be required at this time, please let us know. We take our responsibilities very seriously and it is our intent to be in full compliance with NRC requirements at all times.
