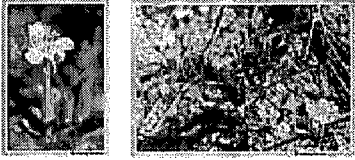
Oenothera humifusa seaside evening primrose

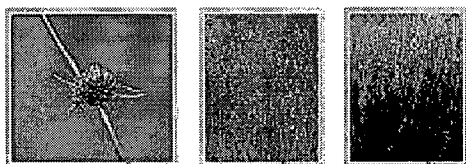

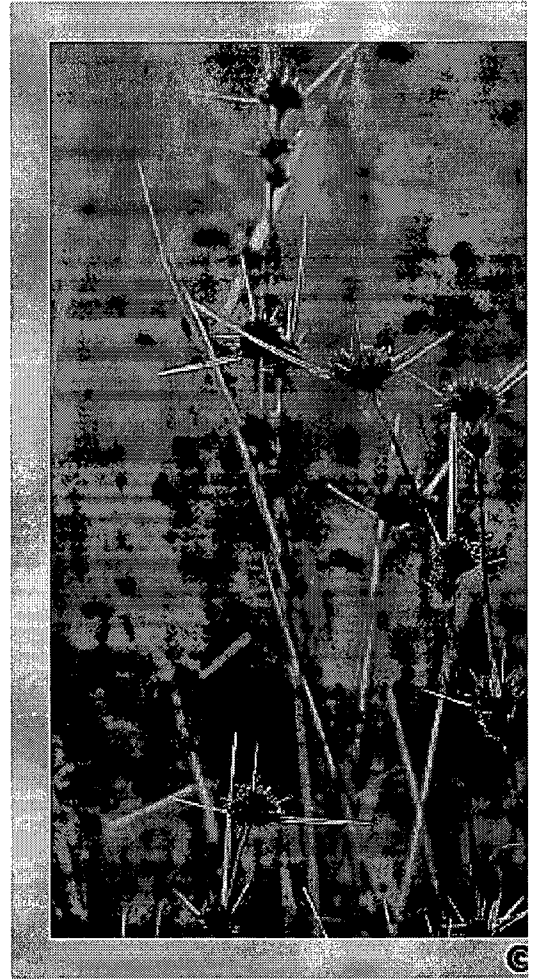

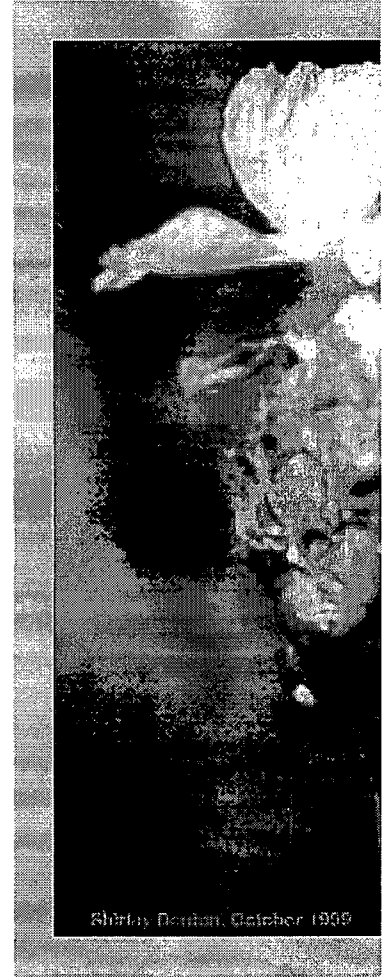
