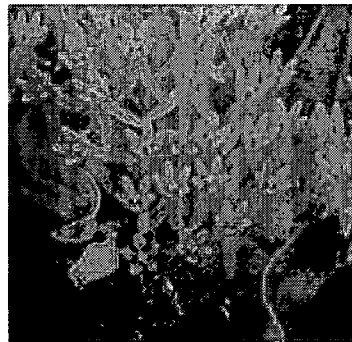





Giant Hogweed now in Wisconsin- *Heracleum mantegazzianum* Sommier & Levier

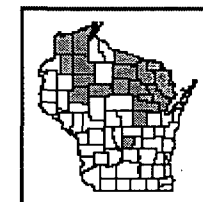

Myriophyllum: from Greek *myrios*, "numberless," and *phylon*, "leaf," alluding to the many divisions of the submerged leaves of these aquatic plants**tenellum:** tender[Link to Detailed

- Status:** Native
- Plant:** perennial 1"-7" aquatic; in dense cluster of toothpick-like stems; stems thin, unbranched; roots buried rhizome
- Flower:** pale 4 parted small; flowers from stem tips that rise above water surface
- Fruit:** nut-like
- Leaf:** small scale or bump
- Habitat:** water to 5' deep; in sandy soil

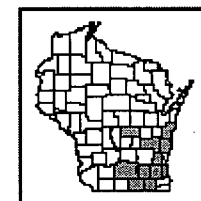
Family Asteraceae

Arnoglossum atriplicifolium (L.) H. Rob.

pale Indian-plantain

Arnoglossum: Greek for *arnos*, "lamb" and *glossum* for "tongue"

atriplicifolium: with leaves like *Atriplex*

Status: Native

Plant: perennial erect 3'-9' forb; stems smooth

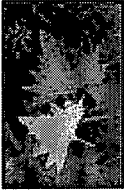
Flower: white >7 parted; head 4 1/2 inch umbel; blooms July-Sep.

Leaf: white beneath, rounded-triangular

Habitat: full sun, partial sun; dry, moderate moisture, to wet; prairies, woods; in sandy, loam soil
