Status of Recommendations

Recommendation 1:

Establish a defined agency-wide incident response plan that includes standards for performance, delineation of the conduct of exercises and drills, and a well-defined objective mechanism for evaluating incident response during exercises.

Agency Response Dated June 27, 2007:

As previously reported, MD 8.2, "NRC Incident Response Program" establishes the responsibilities and key requirements for the NRC Incident Response Program. On June 16, 2006, the Chairman approved the final version of MD 8.2. NRC implemented the revised NUREG-0728, "NRC Incident Response Plan," on April 14, 2005. The agency has posted this document on its NRC's external Web site (http://www.nrc.gov/what-we-do/emergpreparedness/respond-to-emerg/incidentresponse.pdf). The staff has incorporated the implementing procedures and other supporting documents that are linked to the NRC IRP into the Incident Response Manual, such as Incident Response Manual Chapter *IRMC) 0210, "Incident Response Self-Assessment Program" (copy attached). IRMC 0210 provides the objective means for evaluating Incident Response exercises and has been used for all FY-07 exercises. The actions needed to establish an agency-wide incident response plan, including the conduct and evaluation of exercises have been completed. The staff recommends this item be closed.

OIG Analysis:

The above statements reflect that the agency continues to work towards meeting the intent of this recommendation. In the OIG December 2, 2004, Status of Recommendations, OIG stated three conditions that must be satisfied to close this recommendation. The agency has satisfied those three conditions and this recommendation is now closed.

Status of Recommendations

Recommendation 3: Update NUREG-0845, Agency Procedures for the

NRC Incident Response Plan, or incorporate relevant

portions into other agency procedures.

Agency Response

Dated June 27, 2007: NUREG-0728, Revision 4 (NRC IRP), issued for

interim use effective April 14, 2005, has superseded

NUREG-0845. The staff has incorporated the

relevant portions of NUREG 0845 into NUREG-0728 and its implementing procedures. A cross-walk

between NUREG-0845 and the implementing

procedures is being performed to ensure there are no procedural gaps. The staff is utilizing a standardized

format for the revised implementing procedures as part of the new IRM. Changes to the National

Response Plan (NRP) may result in the staff revising the associated implementing procedures. Incident Response (IR) Position Procedures will be completed by September 1, 2007. The IR Team Procedures are

scheduled for completion by December 1, 2007. The remaining Support Procedures are on target for

completion by September 1, 2008.

OIG Analysis: Recommendation 3 will be closed when NRC

completes revisions to implementing procedures and incorporates them into the new Incident Response

Manual.

Status of Recommendations

Recommendation 4: Periodically review regional incident response

programs to ensure NRC's Incident Response

Program is carried out consistently across the agency.

Agency Response

Dated June 27, 2007: The staff completed its plan and implementation

schedule to review the regional response activities for consistency and provided them as an attachment in the April 3, 2005, status report. The periodic reviews of the staff's implementation of existing manual chapters and incident response team position procedures began with the FY 2007 headquarters participation exercises. The Incident Response Self-Assessment Program will be implemented in one Region by September 30, 2007, with additional

regional and headquarters assessments scheduled on

the continuing basis.

OIG Analysis:

Recommendation 4 will be closed when NRC

completes the initial regional reviews.

Status of Recommendations

Recommendation 8: involving multiple sites.

Periodically conduct incident response exercises

Agency Response Dated June 27, 2007:

In March 2006, the staff successfully conducted a multiple event tabletop exercise that included the participation of all the regional offices. The purpose of the tabletop was to test the key elements of IRM Chapter 0920, "Incident Response-Multiple Incidents." On March 21, 2007, the Dresden Exercise, which was observed by an OIG staff member, successfully demonstrated the Agency's ability to conduct a multiple incident exercise. As a result, IRMC 0920 will be revised to include the requirement to conduct a multiple incident exercise every two years. All actions for this item have been completed and the staff

recommends the item be closed.

OIG Analysis:

Recommendation 8 will be closed when IRMC 0920 is revised to include the requirement to conduct a multiple incident exercise very two years.

Status of Recommendations

Recommendation 11: Revise the NRC Incident Response Plan to better

define the incident response to emergencies involving regulated fuel cycle facilities and nuclear materials.

Agency Response

Dated June 27, 2007: In lieu of revising NUREG-0728 to include

improvements to guidance for incident response to emergencies involving fuel facilities, NRC will provide updated guidance in the Response Technical Manual (RTM), supplements for fuel cycle facilities. The staff is currently working with the Office of Nuclear Material Safety and Safeguards (NMSS), and the Fuel Cycle Manual Chapter will be completed by March 31, 2008.

OIG Analysis: Recommendation 11 will be closed when NRC

completes the updated guidance in the RTM.

Status of Recommendations

Recommendation 13: Update Response Technical Manual Supplements for

gaseous diffusion plants.

Agency Response

Dated June 27, 2007: Staff has begun an effort to update the RTM

Supplements for the Paducah and Portsmouth Gaseous Diffusion Plants (DGP). The effort is

focusing on evaluating pertinent information, such as locations and quantities of UF6 which would affect the event assessments made by the NRC should an accident occur. A site visit was conducted the week

of May 21-25, 2007, for both plants. Current information in the RTM was compared to UF6 inventories and is being used to determine whether related information in the RTM are effective for event assessment activities. Once the new information has been evaluated, the staff will determine what revisions to the RTM Supplements are warranted. The RTM

update remains on target for completion by

November 15, 2007.

OIG Analysis: Recommendation 13 will be closed when NRC

completes the updated RTM supplements.

Status of Recommendations

Recommendation 14: Improve and expand outreach for licensees to

enhance licensees' understanding of NRC's Incident

Response Program.

Agency Response

Dated June 27, 2007: The staff has issued and implemented guidance for

> conducting incident response outreach activities with licensees. The staff has increased licensee outreach at different venues both at headquarters and in the regions. This includes increased outreach with licensees before exercises, tours and briefings with licensee officials at the Headquarters Operations Center and Incident Response Program presentations at stakeholder workshops and conferences. The staff is working with a contractor to develop a multi-media disk (CD/DVD) for licensees and other stakeholders on the NRC's Incident Response Program. In addition, the staff has developed standardized outreach presentations for licensees and other stakeholders. The staff is on schedule to complete

the multi-media disk by September 30, 2007.

OIG Analysis: The agency's actions address the intent of OIG's

recommendation. Recommendation 14 is closed.

Recommendation 16: Develop and implement a well-defined, agency-wide

training program to meet incident response

commitments.

Agency Response Dated June 27, 2007:

The staff has completed the actions necessary to implement a formal incident response training and qualification program. The staff has identified program goals and key development milestones and has issued IRMC 0310, "Incident Response training and Qualification Program." Under this program each responder is required to complete general response training and position-specific training and participate in an exercise before being qualified. Qualifications are being tracked using qualification cards issued to each responder. Responders are also required to requalify periodically. The staff has developed and is using web-based training modules that responders can use to complete their required training. A process has been established for the qualification records to be tracked by the Office of Human Resources. All actions for this item have been completed and the

staff recommends the item be closed.

OIG Analysis: The corrective actions satisfy the three conditions

stated in the OIG December 2, 2004. Status of

16 is closed.

Recommendation 17: Establish a centralized system for tracking successful

completion of training activities by individual and

position.

Agency Response

Dated June 27, 2007: Implementation of IRMC 0310, "Incident Response

Training and Qualification Program" established the

process that is now being used for tracking completion of IR training and qualifications. All actions for this item have been completed and the

staff recommends the item be closed.

OIG Analysis: The agency's actions address the intent of OIG's

recommendation. Recommendation 17 is closed.
