


ORD's Organization

ORD Policies and Procedures Manual Chapter 1 - General

RESPONSIBILITIES

Assistant Administrator for Research and Development

The Assistant Administrator for Research and Development (AA/ORD) is responsible for approving all ORD policies when there is an Agency delegation of authority to Assistant Administrators and the delegation is being redelegated.

Deputy Assistant Administrator for Management

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The Deputy Assistant Administrator for Management (DAA for Management) is responsible for approving ORD policies which are not subject to Agency delegations. The DAA for Management has been delegated authority to serve as the ORD Senior Resource Official (SRO).

Laboratory/Center/Office Deputy Directors for Management



Laboratory/Center/Office (L/C/O) Deputy Directors for Management are responsible for ensuring that draft ORD policies and procedures are forwarded for comments to the appropriate individuals, and for submitting consolidated L/C/O comments when necessary. L/C/O Deputy Directors for Management also are responsible for appointing Policies and Procedures Coordinators (PPCs) in their respective L/C/O.

Office of Resources Management and Administration

The Office of Resources Management and Administration (ORMA) has the lead responsibility for the development and oversight of all ORD policies and procedures.

ORD Chief Information Officer

The ORD Chief Information Officer (ORD CIO), located in ORMA, is responsible for approving policies regarding information technology and information management.

ORD Policy Coordinator

The ORD Policy Coordinator is a member of ORMA's Policy Review and Evaluation Staff (PRES) who has primary responsibility for coordinating all phases of the policy development
