Please find below Florida reply to NRC's request in RCPD 07-004. RCPD is attached for reference only but the information requested is "The NRC therefore requests that each Agreement State provide citations to any State statutes, regulations, or other laws that might affect a State's ability to collect fingerprints or the use of information obtained as a result of the required FBI identification and criminal history records check. The NRC requests that responses be provided by July 30, 2007."

Our legal staff did not find any laws, statutes, or regulations that would affect our ability to use the information obtained as a result of a FBI identification and criminal records check. (This was based on keyword searches.) They stated that as long as NRC indicated that this is a Health and Safety (H&S) issue, we do have the statutory authority to promulgate H&S rules on this issue. It is not as clear that we have the statutory authority for bureau to collect the fingerprints unless it is for H&S. Even then, questions may be raised that the collection of fingerprints is a "security" and not a H&S issue.

Florida's Bureau of Radiation has NO interest in using it's personnel for the actual collection of fingerprints, or sending them to NRC or other federal agencies.

We also do not have authority to charge or collect fees for this activity.
