Acceptable permanent records include sketches, written descriptions of specific locations where radioactive material is used or stored, and records of any leaking sealed sources, tracer material spills, contaminated waste storage areas, or other unusual occurrences involving the spread of contamination in or around the licensee's facilities or field stations. Permanent decommissioning records described above are not required for temporary job site locations.

In your response to Item 9.E., you state, in part, that it is unlikely that a defect in the PFN tool would result in a hazard such that notification of the Commission would be either necessary or advisable. We feel that this is not an accurate statement; therefore, please commit to adopting appropriate procedures for identifying and reporting to NRC defects and noncompliance, as required by 10 CFR 21.21(a).
