SUBJECT: RESPONSE TO ENERGY METALS CORPORATION'S JUNE 28, 2007
REQUEST TO INITIATE THIRD-PARTY CONTRACTING FOR THE
ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT

Dear Ms. Wichers:

On June 28, 2007, Energy Metals Corporation (EMC) requested that the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) initiate third-party contracting for the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) in support of EMC's *in situ* leach (ISL) uranium extraction license application review. This letter responds to your request.

The NRC is projecting that it could receive approximately 14 new or expansion applications over the next two years. Given this and the lack of funds in the NRC's fiscal year 2008 budget for individual EISs, NRC has decided to develop a Generic Environmental Impact Statement (GEIS) for ISLs. We believe that using a GEIS approach is the most efficient and effective way to meet the expected demands on our limited resources and also meet our responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act. In regard to environmental reviews for the new ISL applications, we intend to use the relevant sections of the GEIS to prepare either a site-specific Environmental Assessment or a site-specific EIS.

The current estimated completion date for the GEIS is January 2009. We are committed to processing your license application in a timely manner and we encourage you to continue to interact with the NRC staff to help ensure development of a high quality application.
