MEMORANDUM AND ORDER  
(Request for Information)

After reviewing the Application and reviewing the requests filed by Jon Scott and by Dr. Jerome Raskin and Dr. Estelle Lit et al., I have determined, pursuant to 10 CFR § 2.1233(a), that it is appropriate to request from Rockwell International Corporation chronologically arranged information about all significant<sup>1</sup> chemical and radiological contamination incidents or releases at Santa Susana Field Laboratory (with respect to activities pursuant to License SNM-21 or with respect to DOE activities conducted in Area IV or in close proximity to licensed activities) since 1969.

<sup>1</sup>That is, producing anything other than trivial results that are very unlikely to cause any detriment to anyone's health and are also very unlikely to cause noticeable loss to the environment.

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
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With respect to each incident or series of incidents<sup>2</sup>, please clearly describe:

1. The date(s).
2. Substance(s) and amount(s) released.
3. Root cause(s) (including citations to reports or studies or reports of off-normal occurrences, if any)<sup>3</sup>
4. Remedial actions concerning the root causes (including the dates of the remedial actions), if any. (I do not need a description of the clean-up or "remediating" actions.)

I would appreciate reasonably prompt filing of this information. Be clear and concise, using figures or charts whenever helpful. References may be made to materials already in the hearing file. Answers should be in writing, under oath or affirmation. Please file the information on or before the Prehearing Conference, September 29, or file a schedule for the subsequent filing of this information.

Also, if there should have been a report of an off-normal occurrence but none was prepared an explanation of the failure to prepare and retain such a report should be provided.
