The Fish Hawks, over 180 members strong, was established on June 8, 1977 with a common goal to form a social fishing club dedicated to good sportsmanship, preservation of the marine environment and safeguarding our natural resources. Today, we are one of the largest fishing clubs in New Jersey.

We believe that our members and their families will benefit from AmerGen's proposed donation of 220 acres which would provide the public waterfront access to Oyster Creek and the south branch of the Forked River. AmerGen's proposal is in direct alignment with the Fish Hawk's philosophy: to safeguard our natural resources. AmerGen should be commended for protecting this tract of land from developers and turning it over the Lacey Township for open space. As an organization, we are particularly supportive of the boat ramp and the walking trails.

In writing this letter, the Fish Hawks ask the NJDEP to grant concurrence with AmerGen's Federal Consistency Certification for Coastal Zone Management.
