RE: Radiation Safety Officer (a Volunteer Position)/Executive Management Letter of Understanding

Dear Dr. Jones:

Your have been appointed the Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) of this facility for our United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission Materials License until December 31st, 2014. This "Letter of Understanding" is prepared to comply with Title 10 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 35.24 (b). This section of the regulations require that you agree in writing to the following:

- Assume responsibility for implementing the Radiation Protection Program
- Ensure that radiation safety activities are being performed in accordance with our own approved procedures and all regulatory requirements.

Furthermore, in compliance with 109 CFR 35.24 (e), (g), the executive management of this facility agrees to provide you as RSO:

- Specific written notification of your authority, duties and responsibilities, see attached.
- Sufficient authority, organizational freedom, resources and management prerogative to:
 - 1. Identify radiation safety problems;
 - 2. Initiate, recommend, or provide corrective actions
 - 3. Stop unsafe operations; and,
 - 4. Verify implementation of corrective actions.

Additionally, any investigatory fees or expenses, up to and including legal fees, as a result of any NRC investigation, will be borne by Bay Regional Medical Center. Bay Regional Medical Center shall hold harmless, indemnify and defend the RSO under all circumstances.

Finally, the Medical Center has the obligation to keep the RSO informed of any operational issues that would affect or influence decisions regarding radiation Safety. Further, the Medical Center has the obligation to follow the advice of the RSO. Failure of the Medical Center on either account would remove the RSO's liability if unsafe practices result, and may be cause to render this agreement null and void.
